
Texas Home Learning (THL) Accommodation Companion Guides


Kirbyville Teachers Know It and Show It!



Every day, teachers are tasked with evaluating student mastery. For some of the most challenging standards, knowing what to look for in student work is difficult and takes time. However, teachers at Kirbyville JH have had the opportunity through Texas Lesson Study to unpack their standards using practices that align with Texas Instructional Leadership (TIL).

Savanna Cates, Sara Davis, Timberly Foster, and Ledah Kelley, teachers representing all content areas at Kirbyville, teamed up with Roxanne Minix-Wilkins from ESC Region 5 during their PLC time. Together, the group used the See It, Name It, Do It protocol to unpack different student expectations (SEs) from the TEKS in their content areas. Each teacher walked away with clear success criteria for what students should know and be able to show if they have mastered the SE. 
Lesson Study Around the World
