Three week 'toilet training for all ages' ONLINE WORKSHOP

Wednesday 19th & 26th January and 2nd March 2022, 10am to 12pm Friday 1st, 8th and 15th July 2022, 10am to 12pm

Do you need help toilet training your child?

Whether it be a young child just starting or an older child who still needs to develop skills towards independent toileting you are welcome to join us.

Sessions will run over three weeks and cover how the bladder develops, skills needed to use the toilet, tips on toilet training, constipation, day and night time wetting and set targets for each child. There will also be opportunities to support each other, share ideas and resources and monitor progress.

The course is 2 hours a week for 3 weeks and limited to 7 families.

- Activities gave a true understanding of how difficult it is for a child with Down syndrome
- Benefitted from hearing other parent's experiences, some really useful tips.

COST: FREE to family members, otherwise £30.

Improve your child's sleep ONLINE WORKSHOP

This workshop is over 3 weeks, Fridays 4th, 11th & 18th February 2022, 10am to 12pm

The workshop will start by discussing sleep and the difficulties that can be experienced with settling and sleeping through the night.

It will then offer the opportunity to share experiences and aim to set action plans to help improve the bedtime routine, settling, staying in your own bed, and sleeping through the night.

The course is 2 hours a week for 3 weeks and limited to 7 families.

 My child is now sleeping in his own bed! Getting more sleep - the whole family has benefitted

COST: FREE to family members, otherwise £30.

Consultations

Consultations are available at a cost of £25 per half hour. These may take the form of discussion around a child's developmental/educational targets or taking part in an EHCP meeting.

Observations

We can come into school to observe your child. This will cost £50 per hour. A report can be prepared following an observation, this will cost £100.

Assessments

We can assess your child, usually at our centre for £50. A report following an assessment will cost an additional £50.







Down syndrome & autistic spectrum condition ONLINE WORKSHOP

Wednesday 16th February and 2nd March, 10am to 12pm each day The workshop will enable participants to share their understanding of how children with a dual diagnosis of Down syndrome and autistic spectrum condition develop speech, language and communication. Using several case studies we will discuss what we know, what we don't know and what we would like to know! There will also be an opportunity to discuss and share ideas on how we manage communication, sensory issues, diet, feeding and unwanted behaviours. COST: £40 per professional(£20 for second member of staff from same school)/£20 per family member.

Our online workshops are delivered via Zoom. The link will be sent to you the day before the training and it will be the same link for all sessions of the course.

Any handouts will be emailed following the session.

Sessions will not be recorded and confidentiality rules will be put in place at each session.

We adhere to our online (Zoom) policy which is available for you to read upon request.

Monday 7th March, 9.30 to 12.30pm

Basic number skills are vital to enable everyday social inclusion and independence. The training will commence with an overview of the learning profile of a child with Down syndrome; exploring working memory and how this impacts on learning numbers. It will detail how children learn basic number skills – recognising numbers, saying number names, counting to find 'how many?' and early hands on addition. It will explore the challenges faced by children who have Down syndrome and other learning disabilities and demonstrate how the use of Numicon as a visual representation of number can help to overcome these difficulties and lead to increased understanding and confidence.

COST: £60 per professional (£15 for second person from same school)/£15 per family member.

Resources available £10. (memory stick or download)


Teaching number skills beyond 10, time & money

Monday 14th March, 9.30am to 3pm

In the morning we will look in detail at tackling number skills beyond 10:

- ♦Rote counting in 10s, 5s, 2s, teens and counting through decades up to 100
- ♦ Recognising 2 and 3 digit numbers, place value and order
- ♦ Counting to find how many beyond 10
- ♦ Adding up and taking away methods to succeed
- ♦ Fractions, multiplication, division and using calculators

After lunch we will tackle time and money



Time: This workshop will equip participants with a structured programme of activities and resources, developed and written by Wendy Uttley, to help them teach the passage of time and then how, step by step, to teach a child how to tell the time.

Money: We will detail a programme written by Wendy Uttley which consists of 120 finely graded activities to help teach a person with Down syndrome or other learning disability to understand and use money. From the early stages of learning the names for the coins to working with pounds and pence this programme is suitable to use with a child from approximately 5 years of age.

COST: £80 per professional (£20 for a second person from the same school) /£20 per family member.

PLACES LIMITED TO 7 FAMILIES

The course will cover an overview of the learning profile of a child with Down syndrome looking at how difficult behaviours may develop. Parents will then be encouraged to focus on a specific behaviour they wish to modify and we will discuss methods and ideas to modify the behaviour. Support staff working with the child are welcome to come along and be involved in the session in a bid to provide a consistent approach.

Each week opportunities will be offered to discuss progress and learn from each other. Please note that this course is primarily for parents. Creche available 10am - 12pm, £10, per child, per session.

Reading, Language Intervention for children with Down syndrome

Monday 4th & 25th April. This training course is over 2 half days, 9.30am to 12.30pm.

The RLI programme detailed in a teacher's handbook and DVD developed and produced by Down Syndrome Education International, provides a systematic structured approach via daily activities that can be finely adapted to each child. The training days will cover the theory behind the programme, how to assess a child to find a starting point, how to monitor and record progress and how to deliver the daily intervention with examples from, and reference to, the teacher's handbook and DVD.

The RLI programme comprises of two strands of intervention; a reading strand and a language strand. The aim of the RLI programme is to:

- •Improve spoken language and literacy skills of children with Down syndrome.
- Improve teaching practice and support educators.

We have for a long time known reading is a strength for children with Down syndrome but not all educators are aware of this or how to ensure the children reach their full reading potential.

- **COST**: £120 per professional (£30 for second person from same school)/ £30 per family member for both days inclusive.
- Excellent. I have already put some things into practice and can see it will
 make a huge difference to lots of our students

Signing and children with Down syndrome

Session 1 - Wednesday 18th May 2022 Session 2 - Wednesday 25th May 2022 Time 9.30 until 11.30am both days

<u>Session 1</u> will cover why we use signing with children with Down syndrome and the signs for manners, animals, food, family and other people, and the alphabet.

<u>Session 2</u> will cover signs for the home, school day, colours, descriptions, time/days, questions and connective/link words. Followed by a discussion on how behaviour can be addressed through introducing signing.



Both sessions will include practice of useful phrases and familiar children's songs. A book "Signing and Down syndrome", covering the signs in this course is available for £7. COST: £80 per professional (£20 for second person from same school) /£20 per family member.



ME, my body, my friends, my life How to teach children & young people with Down syndrome about their bodies, keeping safe, privacy, social boundaries and self help skills.


This course is over 2 days Wednesday 8th & 15th June 2022, 9.30am to 3.30pm. If needed it can be delivered online over 4 sessions. This would reduce the content of the course to 2 hours each session, 10am to 12pm and extend the course a further two days to Wednesday 22nd and 29th June The course will cover:

- How important such training is for young people with learning disabilities. Names for body parts. Privacy.
- Puberty for girls, puberty for boys.
- Feelings, personal hygiene, self help skills.
- Touching, hugging, affection, friendships.
- Safety in the community. Assertiveness. Abuse prevention strategies. How do we become our own protector?



The signs for this topic are also covered and available in a book -SRE and Down syndrome cost £6. A Memory stick of resources & activities is available to buy at a cost of £10.

COST: Subsidised fees £60 per professional (£30 for a second professional from the same school)/ **FREE for family members otherwise £30**. This includes a folder of handouts.
