District outcomes

Cambridge City

• Age UK's Cherry Trees Day Centre will be funded for the next three years.

South Cambridgeshire

- Both Moorlands (CHS) and Over Day Centre were successful applicants for three-year funding.
- Other activities funded by Older Adults Social Inclusion grants include:
 - Hope Against Poverty's community pop-up hubs, and
 - Cambridge Online's community-based digital inclusion project.

East Cambridgeshire

- Burwell & District Day Centre will be funded for the next three years.
- Community car schemes will continue to be funded and delivered by both Voluntary Community Action East Cambs and Cambridge Dial a Ride.
- In Littleport, the Field Theatre Group will offer a social inclusion activity called Reach Out! and the Rock Solid Community Hub will offer a Friday lunch club.

Huntingdonshire

- A number of day centres will be funded for the next three years, including:
 - The Voluntary Welfare Association in St Neots
 - CARESCO in St Ives and Green End, and
 - Warboys & District Day Centre.
- Residents in Ramsey will also benefit from the Ramsey Senior Lunch Club, which has also been funded.

Fenland

- The Oasis Centre and Monday Club (both Age UK), along with the March Day Club (Caring Together) were all successful bidders.
- Cambridgeshire Older People's Enterprise (COPE) will be offering a Friendship Club in March.
- Activities will be delivered by JG Next Generation (Box and Brew) and Peterborough United Foundation (Mindful Motion).
