Highway Disruption Brings Improvements to Village

Phase One Improvement Works have now been completed at the Wetherby Way junction.

Phase Two will be the Station Road/Chester Road Junction with a variety of improvements such as new crossing points. Work will stop during December and re-start in January with an expected finish date towards the end of March 2020.

Phase Three is expected to start in April and finish in July. It will focus on the Ledsham Road Junction and the central part of the village. This will include the removal of the northbound, left turn filter lane from the A41 into Ledsham Road. In addition we will see changes to the crossing points and the addition of 15 on-street parking bays.

All works above are subject to delays but we will try to keep you updated as work is progressed.

Development Group Update

The Little Sutton Village Regeneration Advisory Group was formed in 2016 following planning permission approval for Redrow to build 2000 homes off Ledsham Road. The aim of the Group was to identify and prioritise village centre improvement projects suitable for the S106 funding provided by Redrow.

The Group consists of an Independent Chair, ward Councillors, business representatives and residents of Little Sutton.

From the initial funding of £30k, the Group commissioned an in depth public realm study of the village, which was publicly consulted on, and provided a blueprint of what can be achieved to regenerate the village centre over a number of years. To date the following enhancements have been made:

- 3x Floral Planters c/w several years maintenance thereof.
- 4x Welcome to the Village signs
- Timber bench o/side the United Reform Church
- Community Notice Board
- External water supply at Little Sutton Community Centre to support the Incredible Edibles

- Addition of external electricity supply at Little Sutton Community Centre and Library for events
- Promotion of the Xmas Shop Window displays
- Financial help with Xmas lighting at the Blue shops and the Churches

Next Spring the long awaited on street parking bays (15) are scheduled to be provided along the A41 outside the Flower shop. Further improvements are being discussed but are subject to additional funds being received from Redrow and these are linked to the no. of homes actually occupied.

No monies can be spent on improving individual businesses or opening up new shops. The Group welcomes realistic and practical ideas for the future and these should be sent to John Hickey, Localities Officer at

Redrow Development Update

140 dwellings are currently occupied, with a further 18 expected by Christmas.

Unfortunately, any further improvements to the village centre and possible traffic calming on Wetherby Way are not scheduled until after 300 dwellings have been occupied.

A41 Limited Waiting Bays Consultation Outcome

Location: Opposite Little Sutton Community Centre (BonBons).

There will be no extension of bays past the church due to additional safety concerns being raised during the consultation.

Instead, a section of the original marked out bays will have the Limited Waiting Revoked. This will allow for "unlimited parking". This work will be completed in the near future. (no date provided as yet).

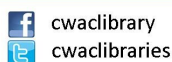

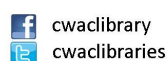

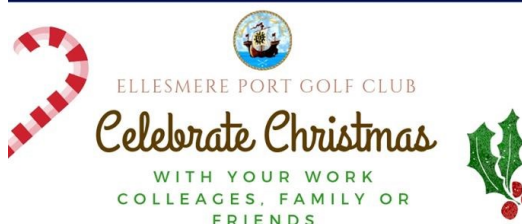
