New Local RE Agreed Syllabus from September 2024



As I hope you are by now aware, we have a new RE agreed syllabus coming soon, due for implementation from September 2024. We are doing a 'soft launch' during this academic year through the following:

- RE Curriculum Symposium in October 2023 (7 sessions, Microsoft teams and recorded so you can catch up if needed)
- Modelling the new units (5 sessions, one for each phase of education, Spring Term 2024)
- Syllabus Launch- likely to be April/May 2024 (date TBC)


10 ideas for monitoring RE WATRE



- 1 Create a questionnaire to identify areas needing support and gauge confidence in teaching various units.
- Gather student feedback through a pupil questionnaire each term to understand their perspectives on RE.
- Engage in conversations with students about their work, allowing for book monitoring and assessing their understanding.
- Explore different assessment methods in RE and share 10 top tips for effective assessment in your school.
- Develop a long-term curriculum plan to ensure a well-structured RE program that aligns with the school's goals.
- Utilize a self-evaluation form, like the Religious Education Quality Mark, to assess the effectiveness of your RE practices.
- Observe & analyse teaching practices using your school's observation pro forma to gather evidence.
- Create a time-bound action plan, rating progress using a RAG (red, amber, green) system.
- Audit and manage your RE resources to ensure they are used effectively and that all artefacts are utilized in lessons.
- f 10 Conduct an audit to assess how RE and diversity are promoted within your school and local community.
