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PREVENT EDUCATION UPDATE - SEPTEMBER 2024

1. Coventry Prevent

Due to a reduction in funding for Prevent in Coventry, we no longer have dedicated Prevent Education Officers for support. Unfortunately, this means I am unable to accommodate individual requests for whole-school training at this time.

2. DSL Forum / Police and School Panels

3. Department for Education Prevent Support

Following the summer's disorder related to the Southport incident, the <u>Education Hub</u> has made available an excellent set of resources and guidance. These include materials on <u>how to discuss violent disorder and the Southport attack with children and young people.</u>

Additionally, I am working with the DfE Prevent Advisor to offer broader training on specific ideologies of concern in Coventry, as well as support for completing risk assessments. This will be offered periodically throughout the year, and I will share further updates once dates are confirmed.
