## **Workshop Summary**

(CP) Embedding meaningful parent/carer and pupil voice into inclusive educational practice:

Drawing on action research projects conducted by SENCOs and teachers, this workshop explores how meaningful parent/carer and pupil voice can be embedded into inclusive educational practice. Through case studies focused on Structured Conversations, Pupil Passports, and person-centred planning tools such as book review conversations, participants will examine practical strategies for fostering collaborative partnerships and amplifying learner perspectives. Attendees will gain insights into how pupil voice can be more deeply embedded within their settings and how it can serve as a powerful foundation for engaging parents in meaningful, productive partnerships. (CP) *Driving Inclusive Practice: The SENDCO's Role in Quality Assurance and Adaptive Teaching:* High-quality teaching that meets the needs of every learner sits at the heart of the SEND Code of Practice. In this interactive workshop, we will explore the crucial role of the SENDCo in quality assuring teaching practice and embedding adaptive strategies across classrooms to ensure inclusive provision. This session will provide practical tools and frameworks that SENDCos and leaders can take back to their schools to enhance teaching and learning for all pupils. - (CP) **Demand Avoidance:** To develop a shared understanding of a demand avoidant behaviour profile and explore reasons why students are demand avoidant in their thinking, learning and communication. To learn how to interpret presenting behaviours of demand avoidance and go on to develop a toolkit of strategies and interventions appropriate for the support and management of students with a demand avoidant behaviour profile. - (CP) Bridging the Gap: Exploring Online Provision for CYP who experience ENAS: This workshop invites SENCos to explore practical, school-led approaches for supporting children and young people who experience Extended Non-Attendance (ENAS), with a spotlight on online educational spaces.

- (CP) *Creating support plans:* Most of our children have a good chance of thriving in a mainstream setting. We need a mindset that understands what has gone on before and what is underlying. Our ways of working need to have at their heart inclusive and reflective approaches which are based on scrutiny, true understanding, and compassion. We will be exploring how we plan for children who have complex needs and looking specifically at how we can support in a bespoke yet realistic way with the resources available.
