<b>Monday 19<sup>th</sup> January</b>	<b>School Massacre Phenomenon:</b> High-School Violence, Online Narratives and Prevent.
<b>Time:</b> 13:00 – 15:00  <b>Delivery:</b> Online MS Teams  <b>Registration:</b> <a href="#">Book Your Place</a>	Providing an overview of the <i>school massacre phenomenon</i> , focusing on patterns of high-school violence and the role of online spaces, including the emergence of so-called “dark fandoms.” The session will explore how harmful narratives are created, shared and normalised online and why this is relevant for Prevent, safeguarding and early intervention.  Participants will leave with an improved understanding of key risk indicators and how to respond appropriately within their professional role.
<b>Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> January</b>	<b>The COM Network:</b> Online Harm, Cybercrime and Prevent Awareness. Including ‘764’.
<b>Time:</b> 10:00 – 12:00  <b>Delivery:</b> Online MS Teams  <b>Registration:</b> <a href="#">Book Your Place</a>	This session raises awareness of the <b>COM network (also known as “The Community”)</b> , an international online network linked to cybercrime, online harm and exploitation. The workshop will outline how the network operates across the UK, US and Canada, including tactics such as social engineering, SIM swapping, IP grabbing and online grooming. It will also explore the network’s links to violence incitement, swatting, data breaches and extreme ideological views, highlighting the relevance for <b>Prevent</b> , safeguarding and early identification of risk in online spaces.
<b>Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> January</b>	<b>Order of Nine Angles (O9A):</b> Occultist Extremism and Prevent.
<b>Time:</b> 09:30 – 11:30  <b>Delivery:</b> Online MS Teams  <b>Registration:</b> <a href="#">Book Your Place</a>	This briefing provides an overview of the <b>Order of Nine Angles (O9A)</b> , an extreme occultist belief system linked to terrorism and serious real-world harms. The session will explore O9A’s core ideology, methods of influence and recruitment and how its narratives can intersect with online spaces and wider extremist ecosystems. Participants will gain an understanding of why O9A is relevant within a <b>Prevent and safeguarding context</b> and how to recognise potential indicators of concern.
