Does your child have any dietary needs due to allergies, medical conditions, or religious beliefs?

Dumfries and Galloway Council has a Special Diet Procedure in place to help ensure that children and young people with specific dietary requirements can receive a suitable meal at school whenever possible.

If your child has a food allergy, medical condition, or religious dietary need, we kindly ask that you complete a Special Diet Request Form. These forms are available from your child's school office.

In line with Natasha's Law and the Food Information Regulations 2014, allergen details for the 14 main allergens are available through iPayimpact. If you need a full list of ingredients or further allergen information, please contact Facilities Services (Catering), who will be happy to help.

Wherever possible we source ingredients with appropriate accreditation such as Food Standard Agency (FSA) approved products, Marine Stewardship Council (MSC) certified fish and free-range eggs.

Free School Meals

Free School Meals for all children in Primary 1–5

Every child at a Dumfries and Galloway Council school can get free school lunches during term-time if they are in primary 1 to 5. This applies to all children – your family's financial circumstances do not matter.

School Meals

Save £400

Your child can receive free school meals if you are in receipt of the following:

From 1 April 2025, it is anticipated that children and young people will be eligible to receive free school meals if their parents or carers are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-based Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit, if your earned income is not more than £850 a month
- Scottish Child Payment (P6 and P7 only)

Free lunches for children at nursery

Children in early learning and childcare can get free lunches only if they have a funded place. Your child can also get a free lunch in early learning and childcare if you get any of the benefits above. **Contact your childcare provider to find out more.**

Scottish Child Payment – Primary 6 and 7

Children in primary 6 and 7 whose families receive the Scottish Child Payment are also eligible for free school meals.
