

What happens next?

All schools in Dudley are required to co-ordinate admissions to ensure that children only receive one offer of a secondary school place on 1 March 2022.

Dudley's admissions service process all applications, dealing with those received by the deadline first. If a school is oversubscribed places are offered according to the criteria given in 'a parents' guide to secondary school admissions 2022/23'.

On 1 March after 2pm email decisions will be sent to those parents who applied via the on-line system. Decision letters will be sent on 1 March, 2nd class post to those parents who applied via a paper application.

Where we cannot offer a place at any of your preferred schools your child will be allocated a place at the next nearest school with places available.

What happens if I am not offered the school I want?

If your child is refused any of the preferred schools you will have a right to appeal and be advised of the process regarding waiting lists for any of the schools refused. The decision letter/e-mail we will send, will give you more information concerning these processes. Please note appeals for Dudley schools are held from late Spring Term 2022 and early Summer Term 2022.

How do I apply?

If your child lives in Dudley and was born between 1 September 2010 and 31 August 2011 you need to start the process of applying for a secondary school place.

This information leaflet will assist you in applying for a place. Further detailed information is contained in 'a parents' guide to secondary school admissions 2022/23'. You should read this booklet before applying for a school place.

If you live in the Dudley Local Authority, there are two ways to apply for a secondary school place from 1 September 2021. Firstly you can apply on-line at **www.dudley.gov.uk/admissions**. This method is preferred by parents as it is quick and easy to do with the following benefits:

- E-mail decision received after 2pm on 1 March 2022
- You can apply 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- There's no risk that your application will be lost in the post as you will get email confirmation that your application has been received
- It's safe and secure

You can apply online at your local library. The library staff will be happy to assist you with the application.

The second method, if you do not have access to the internet, is to complete a paper application form. You will need to contact the School Admissions Service on **0300 555 2345** for a form to be issued to you. Parents are strongly encouraged to return the form by recorded delivery as acknowledgments of receipt are not sent by the service. Please note if you do choose this method your offer is posted on 1 March direct to the home address.

Important points

You must apply by the closing date of 31 October 2021. Failure to apply by this deadline will mean your application may not be considered until after applications made by the deadline.

Parents can express up to six school preferences on the application form including schools outside the Dudley Local Authority. We would encourage you to use all the six preferences; **there is absolutely nothing to gain by only putting one preference.**

Do not assume that your child will get a place at a secondary school without you having to apply, even if you have older children already attending the same school.

Please ensure you have your council tax reference number to hand when completing the application to help verify your home address if necessary.

Certain schools select by academic performance, aptitude, faith or sport and require you to complete a supplementary information form (SIF) in addition to the Local Authority application form. **Please note that some of these schools have different closing dates for the SIF.** For your application to be valid, it is imperative that you complete both forms by the specified date otherwise your application may not be considered. Please refer to the admissions arrangements for the school concerned.

The SIFs for Dudley schools are available online, or you can obtain them directly from the schools. For schools outside the Dudley Local Authority you must contact the appropriate Local Authority directly.

When applying for a school ensure you have read the school's admission criteria. This information is in 'a parents' guide to secondary school admissions 2022/23'.

You may wish to consider how popular a school is before you apply and how likely your child is to get a place. The parents' guide includes details of places available at each Dudley secondary school and a breakdown of the offers by criteria for the last four years - you may find this information helpful. To assist with this process, you can contact Dudley's admissions service on **0300 555 2345**, staff will be able to provide you with an approximate distance measurement from your home address to any Dudley secondary school.

Schools hold open evenings for parents to look around and speak to teachers, and these can be very helpful. These dates are detailed in the parents' guide to secondary schools 2022/23 and the enclosed leaflet. Admissions staff will be present at some of these evenings to provide guidance with the admissions process.

When you make an application, consider how your child will get to school as you are responsible for ensuring your child arrives at school. Information on school transport is available at: **www.dudley.gov.uk/residents/learning-and-school/education-travel-support**

Accuracy of applications

Parents may be required to provide proof to confirm their child's legal home address. If we have reason to believe that an application has been made using intentionally misleading or fraudulent information we will investigate.

If a place is offered on the basis of misleading information it may be withdrawn, as in previous years, and offered to a child who has a higher priority under the admissions criteria.

As an authority we must ensure that every child is treated fairly and school places are allocated based on accurate information.

Dudley Council wants to make the application process as smooth as possible for you and your child so please keep the Schools Admission Service updated about any changes to your details, for example a house move, which may affect your application and could result in any offer being withdrawn.

Parental responsibility

If there are persons with parental responsibility for your child, who are not living at your home address, you have a duty to ensure that you notify/consult those persons regarding your child's application. The Council is not in a position to intervene in disputes between parents over the school applications and will request that these are resolved privately.
