# **Key Changes Resulting from the Review**

### 1. Refinements to the Inspection Framework

- The framework has been updated to better reflect current challenges and best practices.
- Adjustments were made in response to feedback from children, families, practitioners, and leaders.

# 2. Stronger Focus on Strategic Governance

- Emphasis on improving leadership and oversight across education, health, and social care.
- Local areas with systemic failings must now submit priority action plans.

# 3. Improved Data Sharing and Coordination

- Local partnerships are expected to enhance how they share and use data to plan services.
- Better integration of systems across agencies is encouraged to avoid fragmented support.

#### 4. Enhanced Joint Commissioning

- Local areas are urged to use data and family feedback to jointly commission services that meet actual needs.
- Stronger accountability for ensuring commissioned services are effective and timely.

# 5. Greater Emphasis on Co-production

- Families and young people must be involved earlier and more meaningfully in service design and decision-making.
- o Co-production is now a key indicator of effective partnership working.

#### 6. Focus on EHC Plan Quality and Timeliness

- Local areas must ensure EHC plans are not only timely but also high quality, reflecting the child's voice and needs.
- Monitoring and quality assurance processes are being promoted.

# 7. Addressing Long Waiting Times

 Partnerships are expected to provide interim support while children wait for services.  Examples of good practice (e.g., family hubs, alternative therapies) are being shared.

# 8. Early Help and Identification

- More investment in early intervention and workforce training is encouraged.
- Local areas are expected to improve developmental checks and early assessments.

## 9. **Better Transition Planning**

- o EHC plans must include clear, actionable transition plans.
- Local areas are encouraged to provide better careers advice and support for independence.

# 10. Ongoing Thematic Reviews

 Ofsted and CQC will continue thematic visits (e.g., children not in school in 2025) to explore specific issues in depth and share learning nationally.
