About this event - As part of the RISE Programme, funded by the Department for Education (DfE), the Council for Disabled Children (CDC) have been invited by local leaders in East Riding to offer a series of two workshops on the theme of co-production. This first workshop will be followed by another, half-day online workshop mapping opportunities for engagement with children and young people to embed co-production across the Local Area SEND Partnership.

Please note: *The workshop is interactive and will require participation from attendees. You will not need to prepare in advance, CDC will share an agenda ahead of time.*

This workshop will consider the co-production 'charter' if that is felt by attendees to be the most effective means of reviewing/refreshing co-production and engagement in the local area.

Audience - This workshop is aimed at a multi-agency audience including parents and carers as well as representatives from health, education, local authority, and social care teams; strategic leaders, service managers and senior practitioners; as well as SENDIASS and voluntary sector organisations.
