About this event - As part of the RISE Programme, funded by the Department for Education (DfE), the Council for Disabled Children (CDC) have been invited by local leaders in East Riding to offer a series of two workshops on the theme of co-production. Following an initial workshop in January, this half-day, online session will map and identify current and potential areas for engaging children and young people, as well as their families.

Audience - This workshop is aimed at attendees from the prior workshop including: parents and carers as well as representatives from health, education, local authority, and social care teams; strategic leaders, service managers and senior practitioners; as well as SENDIASS and voluntary sector organisations.

- Highlight areas of good practice within East Riding to build on.
- Identify potential barriers to effective co-production, including how to engage harder to reach communities.
- Action planning for progress and future work in co-production.
