Books

All our libraries have a wide range of fiction, non-fiction, large print, books for children and young people, and much more.

Books are free to borrow for three weeks. If you would like to extend the loan period there are many ways you can renew your books. Visit us online at eastsussex.gov.uk/renew, download our app to manage your account, pop into any library or call us on 0345 60 80 196.

eBooks, eAudiobooks, eMagazines

eBooks, eAudiobooks and eMagazines can be downloaded for free to your own computer, tablet or smartphone. Visit eastsussex.gov.uk/eBooks for more information on how to choose from over 7,000 titles, with more added weekly.



Activities for the under-5s

Free *Rhymetimes* and *Storytimes* are held in many of our libraries and are suitable for the under-5s. Parents can meet up and take part.

To find out when *Rhymetimes* and *Storytimes* happen visit eastsussex.gov.uk/libraryevents or talk to the staff in your library.

Children five and under will receive a *Bookstart* pack with free books, these are gifted through health visitors and at nurseries and pre-schools. *Bookstart* is a national scheme offering free books to children under five years old and advice to their parents on sharing books with children from a very early age.



Activities for children

Every year we run a **Summer Reading Challenge** aimed at 4-11 year olds, encouraging children to read over the summer holidays. Visit eastsussex.gov.uk/src from mid-July to sign up.

We run after school coding clubs in some libraries for 8-13 year olds, teaching animation, games and website design. Coding kits are available to borrow from all our libraries, as well as a great range of coding books.



Learning

Our libraries offer a variety of learning opportunities. You can access our bitesize online tutorials across a whole range of everyday digital tasks from home, from the library – from anywhere with internet access!

If you're seeking a qualification, our **Learning Centres** offer accredited courses in English and Maths (free of charge) and Computing (fees may apply subject to income).

Family history research



For people wanting to research their family history, we have free access to both *Ancestry* and *Find My Past* websites on our library computers, plus books and eMagazines on genealogy. Some libraries also have family history volunteers who may be able to help with your research.

Health and Wellbeing resources

Every library has a section that can help you understand and manage your own health and wellbeing. There are book collections on topics such as mental health, dementia and other long term conditions.

Reminiscence resources

Reminiscence resources include activity books, films, music, pictures, jigsaws and other objects which help to awaken memories of people's life experiences. They can be useful when working with older people, including those with dementia or disabilities, either in a group setting or on a one-on-one basis.
