Personalised Technology Living life to the full

Personalised Technology comes in many different forms - the right technology in the right place can make a big difference to someone's independence. This training will look at:

- What kinds of technology are available
- The outcomes that the right technology in the right place can help people achieve
- How you can start introducing assistive technology in your services

After the training staff will have developed an action plan Identifying low tech solutions to **aid the people they support**. See here for examples of what is available. These items will then be **purchased** as part of the project for you to use and if successful, the service will keep them after the project has finished.

Audience: Support workers/care providers for supported living & residential services. Open to those that provide support to **learning disabilities** & **other vulnerable adults.**



New end of life care e-learning pathway for care workers

An updated learning path has been added to the elearning programme End of Life Care for All (e-ELCA) designed for care workers supporting people near the end of life.



The aim of the learning path is to provide care assistants with a greater understanding and confidence when caring for individuals near the end of life and to offer support for their families. It's relevant for those working in care homes and domiciliary care/care at home services.

The learning path has been updated with support from Skills for Care and includes core and additional recommended e-learning sessions. The e-ELCA e-learning programme was developed by Health Education England e-Learning for Healthcare (HEE e-LfH) and the Association for Palliative Medicine (APM) to enhance the training and education of the health and social care workforce.
