Types of specialist toothbrushes

Collis curve – For carers and individuals with poor dexterity

The Collis curve has curved bristles to go around the teeth and brush the gums at the same time as the rest of the tooth. This means the toothbrush only has to be used in a backwards and forwards motion on the biting surface of the teeth.




Dr Barmans- For carers and individuals with poor dexterity

The Dr Barmans is similar to the Collis curve. The bristles are straight rather than curved. The brush brushed all 3 surfaces at the same time so you only need to brush in a backwards and forwards motion on the biting surface of the teeth.

Oralieve 360° toothbrush- For sore mouths
