What is supported housing?

Having suitable and stable accommodation is crucial for well-being. Supported housing enables people who need support to live as independently as possible as part of the community. With the right support, people can thrive in this environment, experiencing increased social integration and inclusion, increased autonomy, improved self-esteem and confidence.

How will residents at the new Kingsway development be supported?

Once operational, the Kingsway development will have a 24/7 staff presence. Each resident will be allocated one-to-one support hours which will be based on their needs and designed to help them to build on their strengths, skills and resilience, and support their mental wellbeing. Prosperity Care and Wellbeing will be providing the support.

About the Kingsway Development

Advance is working with Gloucestershire County Council and construction group, Kitto to develop a new affordable supported housing scheme in Kingsway for people with mental health conditions.

The development includes 21 one-bedroom apartments along with a communal lounge and garden, reception area, office and car parking.
