## RESURFACING WORKS – HUNTLEY STREET ROAD CLOSURES AND ACCESS RESTRICTIONS

Dear Resident / Business,

As part of the West End Project, we will be resurfacing the section of Huntley Street between University Street and Grafton Way. We are working on these dates after extensive consultation with the local hospitals and businesses to minimise the impact on UCLH Hospital, the London Ambulance Service and the wider road network.

Completion of this work will require weekend working on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> February and Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2022. Signed diversion routes will be in place for road closures and access will be maintained for key medical deliveries and access.

### Summary of work

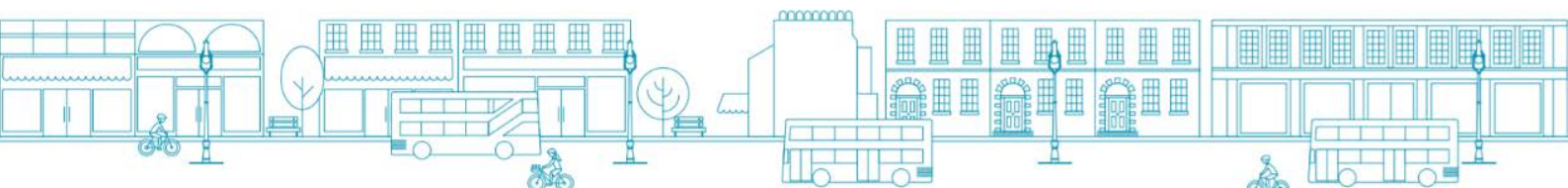
- Resurfacing work will be taking place on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> February and Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2022 on Huntley Street between Grafton Way and University Street.
- We will also be removing 5.28m of Pay by Phone parking on University Street on the southern side near the junction of Huntley Street and replacing this with double yellow lines.
- Working hours will be 8am – 6pm on Friday and 9am – 6pm on Saturday.
- The only work outside of these times will be setting up and taking down of the diversion signs.

The webpage will be updated if there are any changes to the planned resurfacing works.

Friday 25 <sup>th</sup> February and Saturday 26 <sup>th</sup> February	Section of Huntley Street between Grafton Way and University Street	Huntley Street between Grafton Way and University Street.  Access to Huntley Street will be available from the junction with Grafton Way only for authorised vehicles for deliveries to the Hospital and UCL Cruciform Building.	Road closures – diversions in place.  Disabled parking, Paid-for-Parking, Motorcycle bays and permit parking will be suspended on University Street and Huntley Street.  The cycle lane on University Street will be closed and diversions in place.  The northern pavement on University Street will be closed between Tottenham Court Road and Huntley Street

## What is the West End Project?

The West End Project is a £35 million public realm project bringing exciting improvements to the heart of Camden's busy West End. The project is delivering a bold vision for the future of the area, which suffered from traffic congestion, road safety issues, narrow pavements, poor air quality and a lack of public spaces.

To help the area to continue to grow and flourish and to address these issues, the project is delivering a number of exciting changes. This includes making Tottenham Court Road, Gower Street and Bloomsbury Street both two way to traffic.

On Tottenham Court Road access to some areas is now restricted to buses and cyclists only during key times. On Gower Street / Bloomsbury Street new cycle lanes have been added, in addition to a new pedestrian crossing in front of UCL. New public spaces are being created in Princes Circus and Alfred Place.

**What will the changes look like?** Bespoke high quality changes are being delivered in each location. Above is an image of Whitfield Gardens which has been rejuvenated as part of the project.
