Facts and Figures:

- The adult social care workforce growth is projected to increase by 29% by 2035
- Potentially up to 490,000 extra jobs will be required by 2035
- In 2020/21 there were 1.67 million jobs in adult social care in England
- There are approximately 5,430,016 carers in England
- 166,363 of the carers in England are children aged between 16 -18 who are currently not in education, employment or training (NEET)
- Every year, more than 2.1 million adults become carers
- Over the next 30 years, the number of carers will increase by 3.4 million (around 60%)

Eligibility criteria

- You need to be unemployed, or not doing other education or training
- If you are aged 16-18, you can choose either of the Level 2 online courses
- If you are aged 19+, you can choose any course depending on your existing skills
- To apply, you will need to show
- A valid ID, for example a passport or a residency card
- Proof of address dated within the last 3 months (you can use a utility bill or a bank statement, for example)
- Proof of JSA, IS, UC or ESA or proof of salary
