| SMS (short message service) text message sent | Consultation with patient or proxy via text message, in place of face-to-face contact. |
| Did Not Attend | Failed encounter type contacts Clinic / Face to Face / Telephone planned contacts with patient or proxy. (Excludes cancelled appointments). |

Reportable activity is defined nationally as activity where there is an opportunity for discussion between the patient (and/or their proxy) and the healthcare professional i.e. face to face contact, telephone contacts, email and SMS, that include sharing health information and or advice with the patient and/or their proxy.

Non-reportable activities from a National (NHSE) point of view include SMS, email contacts / conversations where contact is being made for the purposes of arranging an appointment. Any contact about, but not including the patient is non-reportable under this definition.

It is important to note depending upon **the Consultation Type** used within the Consultation Properties section, will determine if this is a reportable activity from a National point of view.

All activity is reported and monitored locally across the LCO.
