



Paid summer work placement for 16-25 year olds through our Summer Jobs Programme.

Opportunities available at many of the area's largest employers.

The programme is open to young people who are at risk of violence or face significant barries to the world of work - the programme is available from the end of July 2024 and will provide young people with the key skills needed to support future employment opportunities while still earning.

The six-week session includes a preparation week and five weeks of work experience, all with the dedicated support of a youth worker.

Where does the programme run?



- **Greater Manchester:** Manchester, Oldham, Stockport, Bury, Rochdale, Tameside, Bolton, Wigan, Salford, Trafford
- West Midlands: Wolverhampton, Coventry, Birmingham, Sandwell, Solihull
- **London:** Croydon, Greenwich, Hackney, Haringey, Islington, Newham, Southwark, Tower Hamlets, Waltham Forest, Camden, Barking & Dagenham

What does the programme involve?

- A preparation week with your youth worker (participants are PAID for attendance)
- 5 weeks of paid work experience, 25 hours a week
- Contribute to an evaluation study



Who is eligible?

Young people must fall into this eligibility criteria

Essential

- ✓ Minimum age 16 (at end of programme)
- ✓ Maximum age 25 (at end of programme)
- ✓ Has the right to work in the UK
- Able to take part in 25 hours of employment each week (with reasonable adjustments)
- ✓ Not currently employed for more than 15 hours per week
- Available to participate in at least 5 of the 6 weeks of the programme
- ✓ Must be able to attend the preparation week
- Living in one of the areas that programme is delivered in and not planning to move out of the area during the duration of the programme
- Not living in the secure estate (at start of the programme)
- Proficiency in spoken English
- ✓ Not currently charged with a serious offence

AND one or more of the following

- Are or have been in contact with Youth Offending Teams;
- Have left the secure estate;
- Attend or have attended an alternative provision institution:
- Have had at least one fixed term exclusion;
- Are or have been persistently absent from school;
- Are or have been in care;
- Have been the victim of violence;
- Are engaged with the Supporting Families programme;
- Have, or have had, a social worker;
- Have been identified at risk of criminal exploitation;
- Have a sibling or parent who have been involved in serious violence.
- Have been arrested & released with no further action
