

The future professional mariner

July 6-8, 2022

In 2022 the South West of England Branch of The Nautical Institute will be leading discussions on the future of the maritime profession at a time of rapid societal change. For 50 years since the founding of The Nautical Institute in 1972 Plymouth seafarers have been heavily involved in activities associated with the Institute. Captain Roy Hughes who later became Deputy Director of Plymouth Polytechnic and President of The Nautical Institute (1984-87) inspired many of his staff to become founding members. Over 50 years the Institute has grown from a small UK based organisation to a worldwide professional body of over 7,000 members.

The South West of England Branch was one of the first two formally recognised by the new Council of The Nautical Institute. The inaugural Branch meeting took place at RAF Mount Batten, Plymouth and focussed on the subject of Modern Sea Survival Techniques. The maritime industry and tertiary education have seen significant changes over the past 50 years and the future sees many challenges ahead. The South West of England Branch, has a membership of about 230 persons and maintains links with its roots, those who are involved in the control of seagoing craft. The Branch provides a sense of belonging and through technical meetings and other activities gives opportunities for members to undertake continuing professional development.

During the two days of activity the Branch will also host the 50th Annual General Meeting. It expects to welcome 100 delegates to the event at Plymouth with many more
