Due to a very busy and successful period with the team working on the Community Investment Fund, the August edition was postponed. Starting this month, we will aim to publish a new edition every 2 months to increase the number of new funds available in each edition.

FEATURED FUND

UK Government - Community Ownership Fund

The Community Ownership Fund will help ensure that communities across England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland can support and continue benefiting from the local facilities, community assets and amenities most important to them. Voluntary and community groups can bid for match funding to help them buy or take over local community assets at risk of being lost, to run as community-owned businesses.

Funding may support the purchase and/or renovation costs of community assets and amenities. In the current Round 3 Window 2, new applicants can bid for up to £2million in capital funding.

COUNCIL-RELATED FUNDING

Community Environment Challenge Fund

The Community Environment Challenge Fund (CECF) can provide support and funding for community-led environmental projects.

Any of the following can be funded:

- Improvements to sports pitches and sports ground pavilions.
- The Contributing Third Party (CTP) payment for the Scottish Landfill Communities Fund and other landfill providers.
- Equipment costs, tidy-up and maintenance activities and reasonable professional fees which are directly incurred in respect of the project.

The projects must be led and delivered by community groups, must make a significant difference to the local environment and be widely supported within the community. In addition, there is a requirement for a long-term maintenance commitment for any projects undertaken through the Fund.

How much would the grant be?

The minimum grant request is £2,500 up to a maximum of £10,000. 50% match funding is required. For example, an application of £2500 would have a total cost of at least £5,000. The whole project can be of any size and there is no defined maximum project cost.

Tayside Contracts Community Fund

In these difficult times, our local communities need even more help. We are fortunate to have a vibrant community sector in our three Council areas; and the contribution of volunteers and local community support is invaluable in helping those most in need. Tayside Contracts is proud to work alongside local communities, and we have set up a Community Fund (with generous Community Benefit Funding from Brakes Scotland, one of our main suppliers) where we can give free services, we specialise in. Tayside Contracts is a shared service owned by Angus Council, Dundee City Council and Perth & Kinross Council.

We are the largest civil engineering construction organisation in Tayside - carrying out £42 million of road repairs, maintenance and construction, winter maintenance, and street lighting improvements each year. We are also Tayside's largest catering organisation – serving over 6.5 million meals every year to schools and community customers – that's 30,000 meals each day.

Our Facilities Management team keep over 400 buildings clean and well maintained, and help ensure all the occupants are safe. If you are a charity or a constituted community group, and you think we could provide a service to you, then you may want to consider our Community Fun. We do the work for you, but you don't have to pay – the Community Fund picks up the cost! Some of the things we could do for local communities include: -

- Carrying out roads/footway improvements and repairs to community facilities such as community hall car parks, or a local pathway;
- Digging trenches for rural community broadband schemes;
- Providing food hygiene or food nutrition training;
- Provision of signage via our Sign Shop for a range of community needs;
- Provision of Traffic Management for a community event.
