HAART: How does ADHD impact girls and is this different to boys?

WHAT IS HAART?

HAART is an online survey study investigating how ADHD affects girls on an emotional, behavioural and educational level.

WHY IS THE STUDY IMPORTANT?

- Though ADHD is one of the most common childhood conditions in girls, we know far less about how the condition affects girls than we do boys.
- HAART will provide valuable information about ADHD in girls and help inform future work conducted by psychologists, schools and other professionals supporting girls with ADHD.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

- Girls between the ages of 11 to 18 years of age receiving education in a UK school or college.
- Participants <u>do not</u> need to have a diagnosis or symptoms of ADHD in order to take part.

WHAT DO WE NEED TO DO?

- Visit us on <u>HAART</u> to let us know you are happy to support us in carrying out the survey in your school. Here you can also register to receive our staff training on identifying and supporting children and young people with ADHD! Training available to all participating schools and colleges!
