Young Carers and the School Census

Young carers were included in the school census for the first time in the Spring. They will continue to be included in the Spring return each year now. This will help ensure that young carers and support for them is an important focus for schools in England.

It's estimated that 10% of young people are young carers... which means that there are 3 young carers in every class in every school.

The percentage that schools logged was much lower than that (0.6%), with 79% of schools in England recording no young carers on their return.

The results for Portsmouth were slightly higher at 0.7%.

This means that lots of young carers aren't getting the support they deserve from their school.

What can you do to help your school identify more young carers... and ensure that you're getting the right help from them?

- Do they know that you're a young carer? If not, think about letting them know.
- Tell them about the free young carers training that Portsmouth Young Carers Service provides all schools and colleges in the city. If young carers aren't talked about in your school, then it's likely that they're not working with us.
- If school/college don't understand how being a young carer affects you, let us know and we can support you to help them understand.
