

RISE Training Programme: 2023 to 2024

A Programme of National Training

Through the RISE contract, funded by the Department for Education, the Council for Disabled Children (CDC) conducted a SEND workforce survey, designed to understand workforce learning needs and identify key content for new training. The Council for Disabled Children (CDC) and the National Development Team for Inclusion (NDTi) will deliver the below training sessions as a result of what was raised in the survey.

Each training session is intended for a different audience, and in some cases, the trainings are run by region. Please see below for the full list of trainings.

1. SEND in the Context of Health: An Introduction

One of the themes identified in the survey was an 'Introduction to Health' including:

- Introduction to Integrated Care Systems
- Roles, remits, and responsibilities – who is who and what do they do (at strategic, operational and individual level)
- Funding and commissioning responsibilities

This training is designed for and aimed at professionals working in the SEND system who would like to increase their knowledge of Health in the context of SEND. *Please note: This training session is not suitable for DCOs.*

Objectives

By the end of this training attendees will have an increased knowledge/understanding of:

- Health roles and remits
- What Integrated Care Systems (ICs) are
- What ICs, and their Integrated Care Strategies, mean for CYP with SEND
- ICs board and partnership structures and governance arrangements (inc. Provider collaborative understanding/place-based partnerships)
- The SEND framework including health specific duties for CYP
- Health regulation and inspection/ombudsman arrangements
- Health funding and commissioning responsibilities

- The NHS Workforce Strategy & Hewitt Review, and their link to SEND
- The link to the Liaison, Diversion & Autism/Mental Health programme.

2. Data, Voice and Commissioning

One of the themes identified in the survey was 'Data, Voice and Commissioning'. This training is designed for professionals working in the SEND system who would like to increase their knowledge of the importance of children, young people and families playing an active part in the commissioning cycle, and how their input should inform strategic decisions.

Objectives

- Increase understanding of the relationship between strategic outcomes, commissioning and voice.
- Increase understanding of tools and approaches for capturing and interpreting lived experience as data.
- Learn from good practice examples.
- Reflect on and share local strengths, challenges and opportunities with colleagues from other local areas.
- Exploring common barriers regarding commissioning in response to lived experience data.

3. Understanding the Equality Act (2010) for Practitioners

One of the themes identified in the survey was a want for better understanding of the Equality Act. This training is for education practitioners and will provide an overview of the Equality Act (2010) in relation to disabled children, and its application in education settings, covering:

- An overview of legislation on SEN and Disabilities in education settings
- What practitioners need to know and do to address inequalities and ensure they do not discriminate against disabled children and young people and those with SEN.
- Reasonable adjustments that create an enabling environment so children and young people can thrive in educational settings.
- How Equality Act duties sit alongside other requirements on providers, including the Early Years Foundation Stage, Ofsted and curriculum requirements.

This training is suitable for education practitioners who want to understand more about the Equality Act and other key legislation and what they need to do to meet the requirements of such legislation.

Objectives

By the end of this training attendees will have an increased knowledge/understanding of:

- The Equality Act 2010
- Other key legislation concerning SEN and disabilities as related to education settings
- Their responsibilities as practitioners
- Reasonable adjustments in education settings

4. Understanding the Equality Act (2010) for Senior Leaders

One of the themes identified in the survey was a want for better understanding of the Equality Act. This workshop is for senior leaders, commissioners and experts by experience and will provide an overview of the Equality Act (2010) in relation to disabled children, and its application in education settings. It will include topics such as:

- Definitions of disability
- The requirement to make reasonable adjustments

- Patterns and duties
- Policies and practice

The workshop aims to enable those with strategic or operational oversight in education to understand what staff must know and schools must do to meet their duties and responsibilities to disabled children and young people.

Objectives

By the end of this training attendees will have an increased knowledge/understanding of:

- The Equality Act 2010
- Other key legislation concerning SEN and disabilities as related to education settings
- Duties as education providers
- Reasonable adjustments in education settings

6. A Local Offer for Social Care and SEND: from Short Breaks to Family Hubs

One of the themes identified in the survey was "A Local Offer for social care and SEND: from Short Breaks to Family Hubs".

This training is aimed at professionals working in the SEND system who would like to increase their knowledge of how early help and the local offer for social care and SEND can be applied to effectively support children and young people with SEND.

Objectives

By the end of this training attendees will have:

- Increased understanding of the legislative framework of early help and the local offer for social care and SEND.
- Increased knowledge of the key services and supports that should be included in the Local Offer, including short breaks provision, family hubs, and how to ensure pathways to services can ensure families are able to access the right support at the right time.
- Increased knowledge and understanding of how to ensure the Local Offer provides clear, accessible advice and information to disabled children and young people and their families.
- Learn from good practice examples of early help services from the local authority project teams funded by the Department for Education's Short Breaks Innovation Fund.
- Reflect on and share local strengths, challenges and opportunities with colleagues from other local areas.
