How are parents, carers and families involved in the SEND and AP Change Programme?

The Change Programme is an opportunity to test changes to the way the whole SEND and AP system works, and it is imperative that parents, carers and families are fully involved in the South East's Change Programme activities. Coproduction and engagement are at the heart of this process.

This document outlines some of the ways in which Parent Carer Forums (PCFs) may be involved in the programme:

- ❖ Each Change Programme Partnership (CPP) has a steering group with strong representation from National Network of Parent Carer Forums (NNPCF) and local PCFs.
- Local PCFs can provide feedback from their communities to inform the reforms and participate in coproduction on new processes.
- The Change Programme will be working closely with parents, carers and families during the evaluation process.
