Aspiring Maths Subject Leaders

A series of sessions aimed at developing aspiring leaders to learn about the role of the maths subject leader with maths-specific subject knowledge to support

What does the programme provide?

Across the Spring and Summer term:

3 workshop training sessions based around the key concepts of subject leadership in maths

Participants will be asked to complete some independent work through gap tasks in their schools between sessions to support their understanding of the role.

Session information

Each session will take place at the Teaching and Learning Centre at The Portsmouth Academy (entrance via Manor Road, PO1 5LB) from 1pm—4pm:

- **Friday 7th March**
- **Monday 2nd June**
- **Wednesday 25th June**

Key concepts – what's covered?

Session1: Setting a vision — understanding school, local and national context for maths education

- The role of the maths subject leader.
- How can we use the National Curriculum for maths, the Ofsted maths subject report and other high-quality materials to inform our vision and planning?
- Drafting a maths intent and considering goals.

Session2: Being strategic; knowing the now — understanding implementing change materials and how to explore your school's current context

- Introduction to the EEF materials for implementing change with a focus on the explore phase to deeply understand a school's context and identify priorities.
- A range of practical, maths specific 'explore' activities to demonstrate 'how to' and consider what we learn from this.

Session3: Being strategic; seeing the future — understanding how to use data analysis and triangulation of explore activities to identify priorities and begin planning for action

- Data analysis – soft and hard data; what it tells you and how to use it.
- Triangulating everything covered so far to identify school's needs
- Prioritisation of needs and the maths subject knowledge and interlinking ideas that underpin them.
- Beginning to action plan
