Fort Nelson

At Royal Armouries Fort Nelson, we are dedicated to bringing history alive for all pupils. Each of our carefully designed Discovery and Study Days are delivered by costumed characters who lead pupils in hands-on, immersive activities and drills, letting them experience what it would have been like to live so long ago. To ensure everyone has a fantastic day, we have developed a series of supportive resources, such as social stories, sensory backpacks, visual timetables, braille, large print, and tactile resources, available for you to use before and during your visit. Our core education staff are also trained in Makaton stage 1 and 2 and can use it during sessions if needed.

Our standard pricing is £5 per child for a day of three facilitated 45-minute workshops. We also offer two free bespoke visits for Aggie Westons per term with varied topics and themes, encouraging our military children to have fun in a new environment while socialising and building relationships with other military children.

Youth Crew

The Royal Naval Sailing Association's Youth Crew project offers fully funded Sailing Courses to the Young People of serving Royal Navy, Royal Fleet Auxiliary and Royal Marine personnel. Funded by Greenwich Hospital, delivered through the Andrew Simpson Foundation, Youth Crew sailing courses are bookable during School Holidays. Choose from weekly, Mon to Fri courses at your local centre or a Residential course at one of our 7 locations across the country. During their course, the young people work towards and achieve their RYA 1&2 and Swim Safe certificate. On completion, Youth Crew participants get "10 Punch Cards" giving them a further 10 sessions of fully funded Sailing to take their RYA qualifications further. Your local centre will be the Andrew Simpson Centre, Eastern Road, Portsmouth for Portsmouth based schools.

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Swim Free

Swim Free has been created to provide free swimming lessons for children and young people from serving Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Royal Fleet Auxiliary families, aligned to the Swim England and Scottish Swimming Pathways.

Funded by Greenwich Hospital and delivered in partnership with the Andrew Simpson Foundation, Swim Free also provides an opportunity for families to build new connections and support their sense of belonging within the Royal Navy community.

Learning to swim is an essential life skill for young people, but also supports and helps them maintain positive mental health, grow their confidence, resilience, and willingness to try new things – all while keeping active.

We are planning to launch in Portsmouth in the next few weeks, with lessons due to start in January 2025. The launch will be phased as pools around the city and surrounding areas come online. Our website <https://swim-free.org.uk/> has lots of helpful information on, as well as a register your interest option so we can contact families directly when a pool comes online in their area. Jessica Glover

My name is Jess and I am a doctoral student at Southampton university currently completing my doctorate in Educational Psychology. The focus of my thesis is to explore the experiences of naval service children who also have special educational needs. In particular my focus is on autistic naval service children and their experiences of separation and deployment, with a goal to draw out implications and best practice for schools and educational psychologists to better support these young people. I am looking to explore experiences from the perspective of the service children themselves, their parents, and the school staff that support them. Therefore, I am looking for naval service children (who have a diagnosis, are on the pathway, or self-identify as autistic), their non-serving parent, and the school staff that support them.

PMK Planter

Aggie's together with the Naval Children's Charity have been given the opportunity to make use of one of six planters in the refurbished, Victoria Park, in Portsmouth. I have approached several schools in the centre of Portsmouth, to assist us in this endeavour. The idea is, if we have enough schools interested in taking part, to have one school a week come to the park during school time, to attend to the planter, watering plants, deadheading plants, planting plants when it is time to do so.... We would also like to 'make things' for the planter on special times of the year, Remembrance Day, Christmas, Easter etc.... the whole school can get involved in this or this could be something for service children only at clubs or get together you have at school. There will be an initial grand planting session, NCC and Aggie's have enlisted the help of a gardener to help us with planting suggestions and planning and maintaining a planter. Schools can get their service children involved in a community initiative in this way. If your school has not been contacted and you are interested in this initiative (maybe you have the use of a minibus and could come along once a half term to help out...) please get in touch with me, Karen Baldwin at karen.baldwin@aggies.org.uk and I will add you to the list of schools that have shown an interest so far. The planter is still in its planning stage and I will share information as and when we know more.
