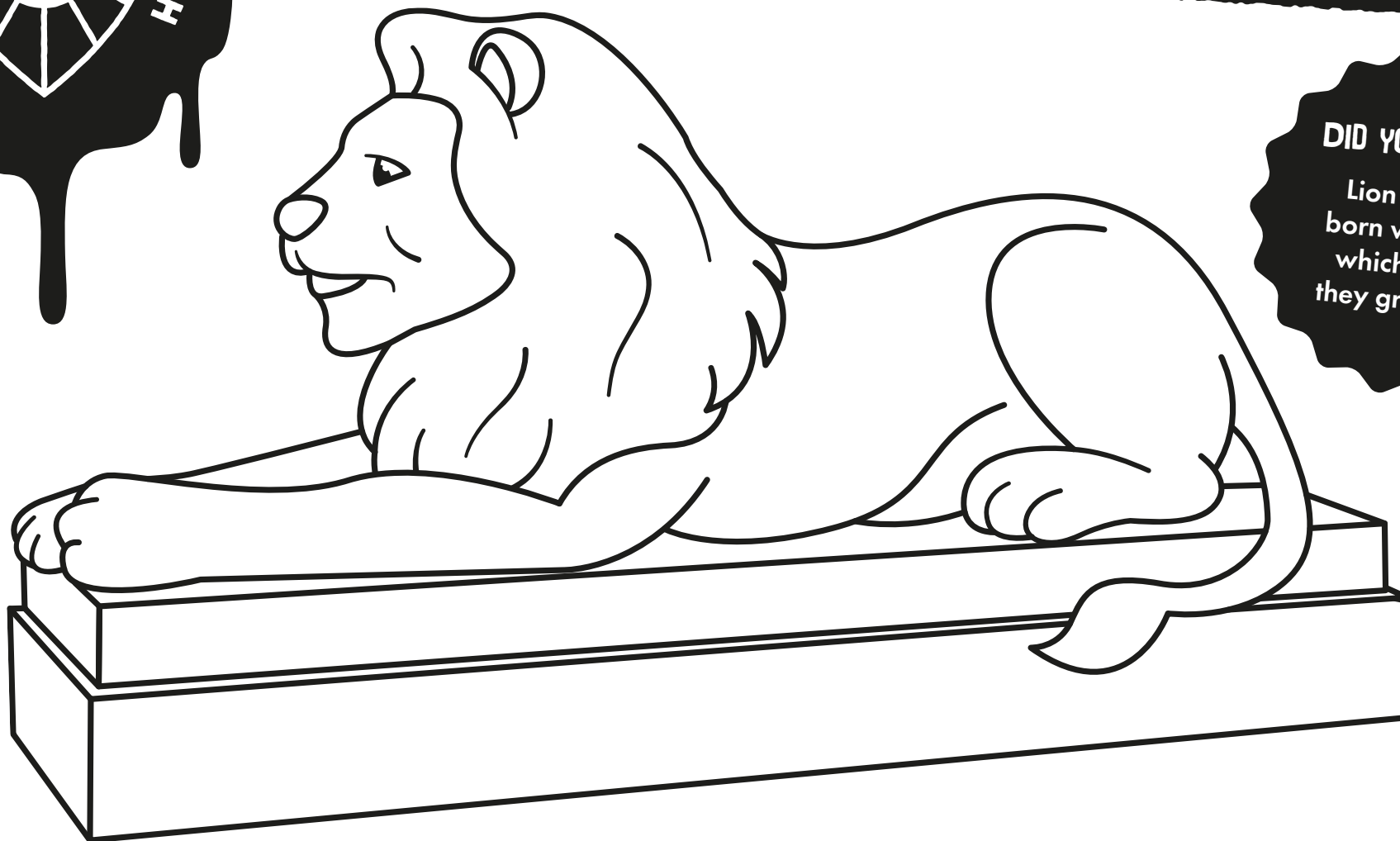

So, grab your grown-up, put on your exploring shoes, and let's go on a Portsmouth adventure you'll never forget!

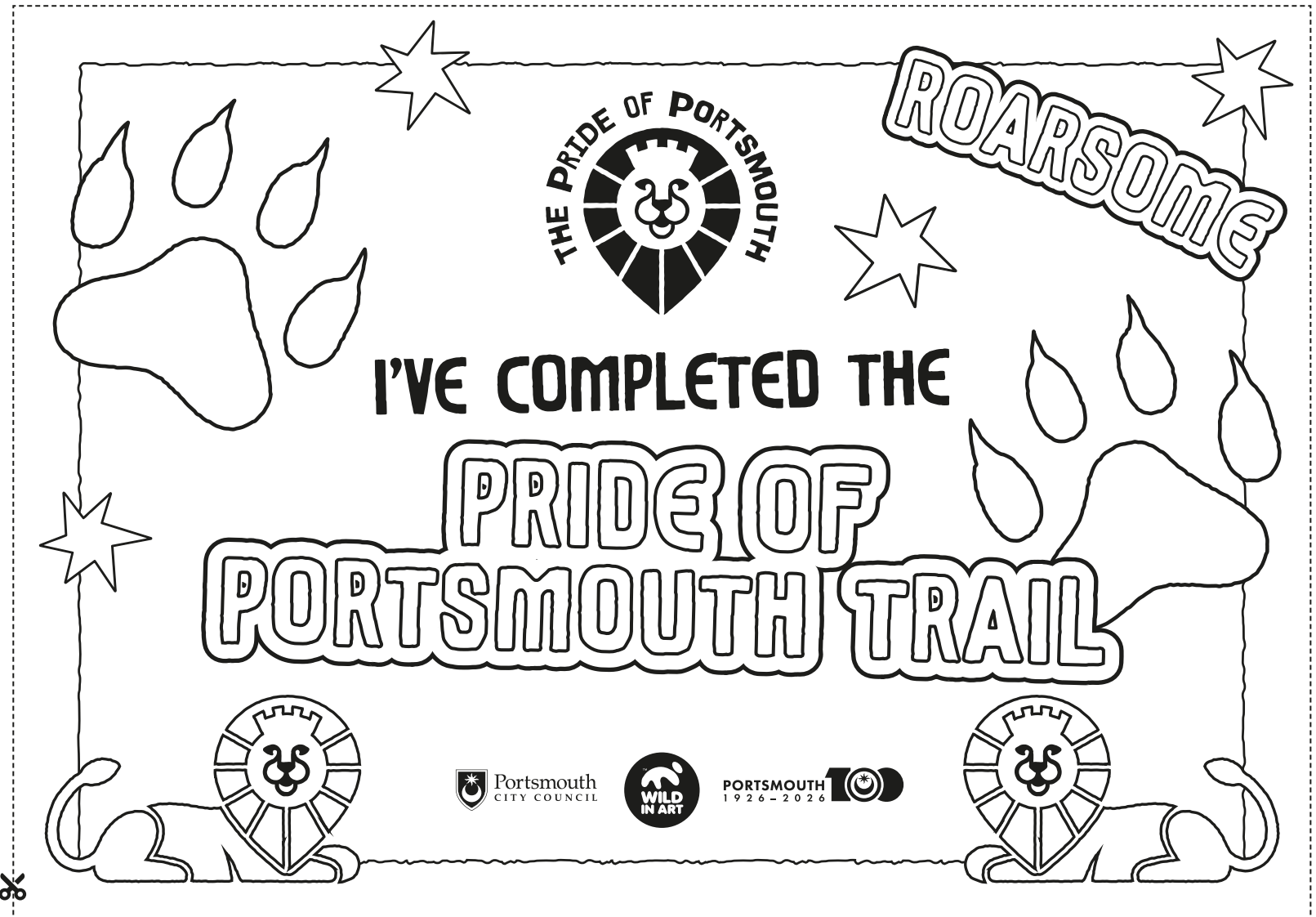

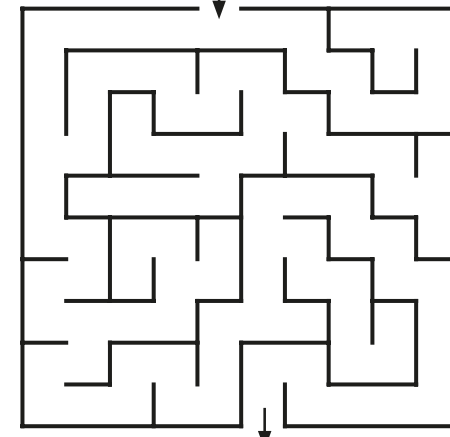

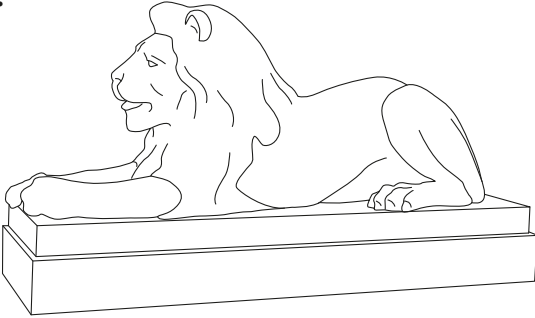
TOP TIP

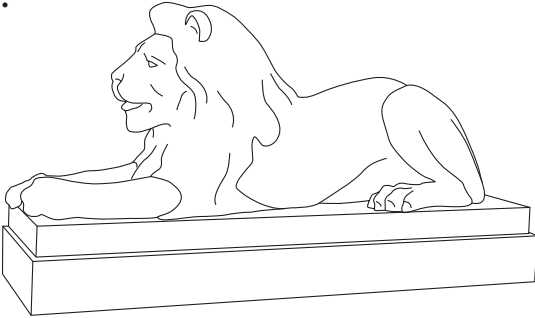

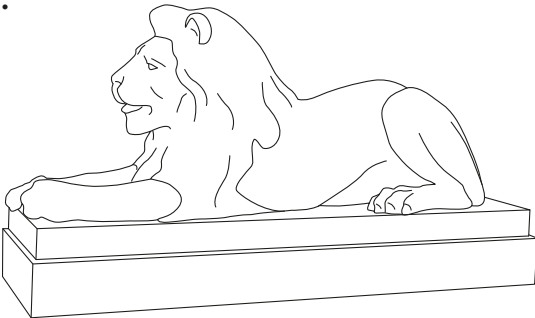

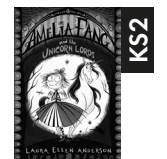
