Integrated Care Boards

- Integrated care board (ICBs):
- ► NHS planning functions previously held by clinical commissioning groups (CCGs)
- ► ICB led by a chair and chief executive, NHS trusts/foundation trusts, Local Authorities, and general practice
- ▶ the ICB will produce a five-year plan for how NHS services will be delivered to meet local needs, informed by the ICP's integrated care strategy and the health and wellbeing strategy must outline how it will ensure public involvement and consultation.
- ▶ ICBs will also contract with providers to deliver NHS services and will be able to delegate some funding to place level to support joint planning of some NHS and council-led services.

Integrated Care Partnerships

- ► Integrated care partnerships (ICPs) will bring together the NHS and Local Authorities as equal partners to focus more widely on health, public health and social care.
- ► ICPs will include representatives from the ICB, the local authorities within their area and other partners such as NHS providers, public health, social care, housing services, and voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations.
- ► The ICP will develop an integrated care strategy, which sets out how the wider health needs of the local population will be met.
- ► In developing its integrated care strategy, the ICP must involve the local Healthwatch, the VSCE sector, and people and communities living in the area. ICPs will not directly commission services.
