Dinnington Crown Green Bowling Club

The Club was established in 1923. It was originally sited next door to the Dinnington Colliery Institute building on Laughton Road, Dinnington as depicted below.

This building was replaced by the new Dinnington Resource Centre in 2000.



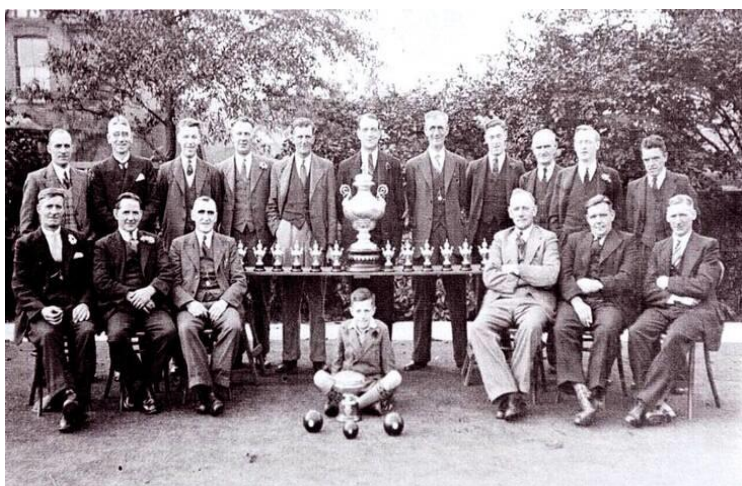
Dinnington Resource Centre is more than ‘just’ a community centre! located in the heart of Dinnington, it opened at the beginning of the new millennium and is purpose built to serve the residents of Dinnington and the surrounding areas.

The **2 Crown Green Bowling Greens** are situated alongside the centre and the Bowling Club is an independent and self financing group.

Plus some other very different members.

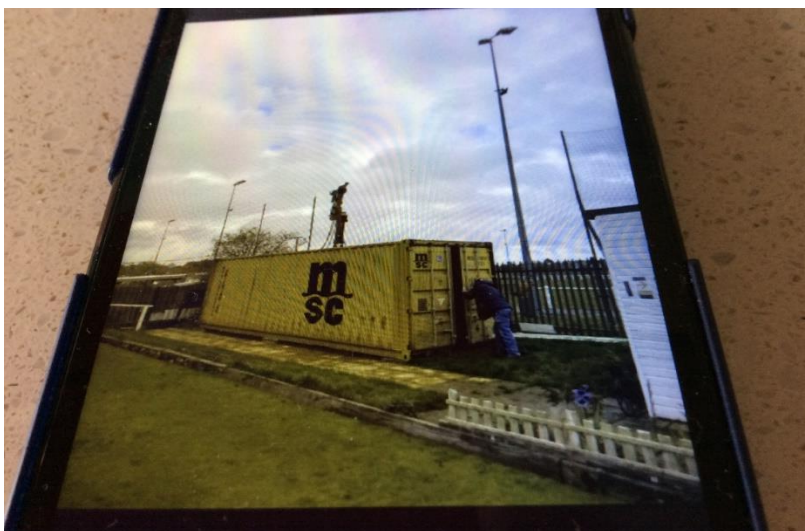
Clearly the Bowling Club is a valuable community resource and a source of exercise and social interaction addressing many of our priorities around isolation and loneliness and engagement with the community.

In 2019/20 Dinnington Ward Councillors provided funding from the Ward Budget for essential equipment and grounds maintenance.

Then in 2020/21 substantial funding of £4250 to enable the club to install a new container storage unit on the site in which to house equipment.
