#### **Case Studies**

### Photographing Thurcroft - Young people focused

Over the past few months, young people at Thurcroft Hub have been working with staff at Clifton Park Museum and local photographer Gez Robinson to re discover images of Thurcroft's past and to help document the village for future generations. The project has been funded by local ward councillors through their community leadership fund.

The young people have visited the museum and delved into Thurcroft's past – exploring items in archives and collections relating to their village. The group looked at archives dating back as far as 1290 and objects such as commemoratives plates, Ostrich feather boas and a yard sticks from the local mine.

The group will then visit buildings and spaces across Thurcroft to help document the village as it stands today. Working with local photographer Gez Robinson, and Arts and Heritage Young people officer Vicky Hilton - young people will learn new skills and photography techniques whilst also documenting Thurcroft. All which will be placed in the archives for the future generations.

All the work was due to be displayed part of a wider exhibition 'Photographing Thurcroft' on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> March, however this was cancelled due to the pandemic and an online exhibition was produced until it is safe to hold an event at the Hub.
