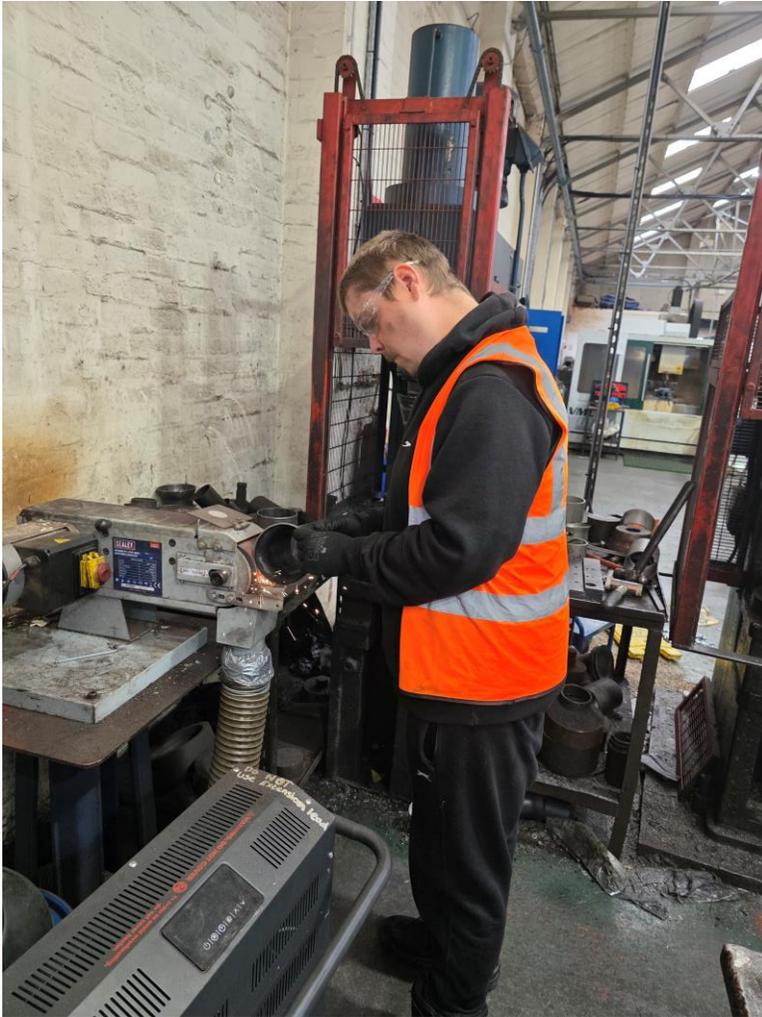


Kristian's Story



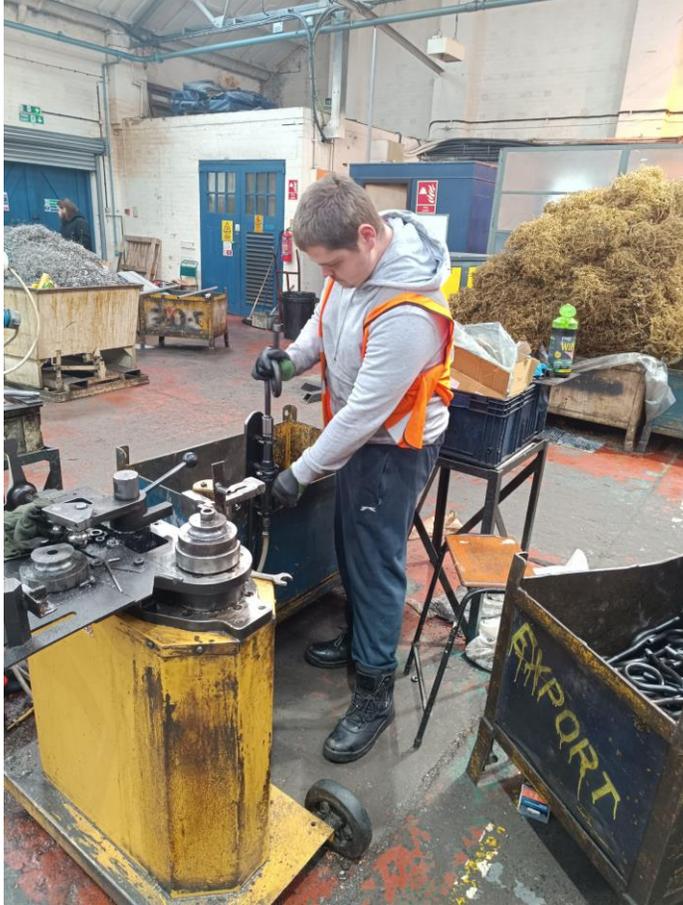

Gemma's Story

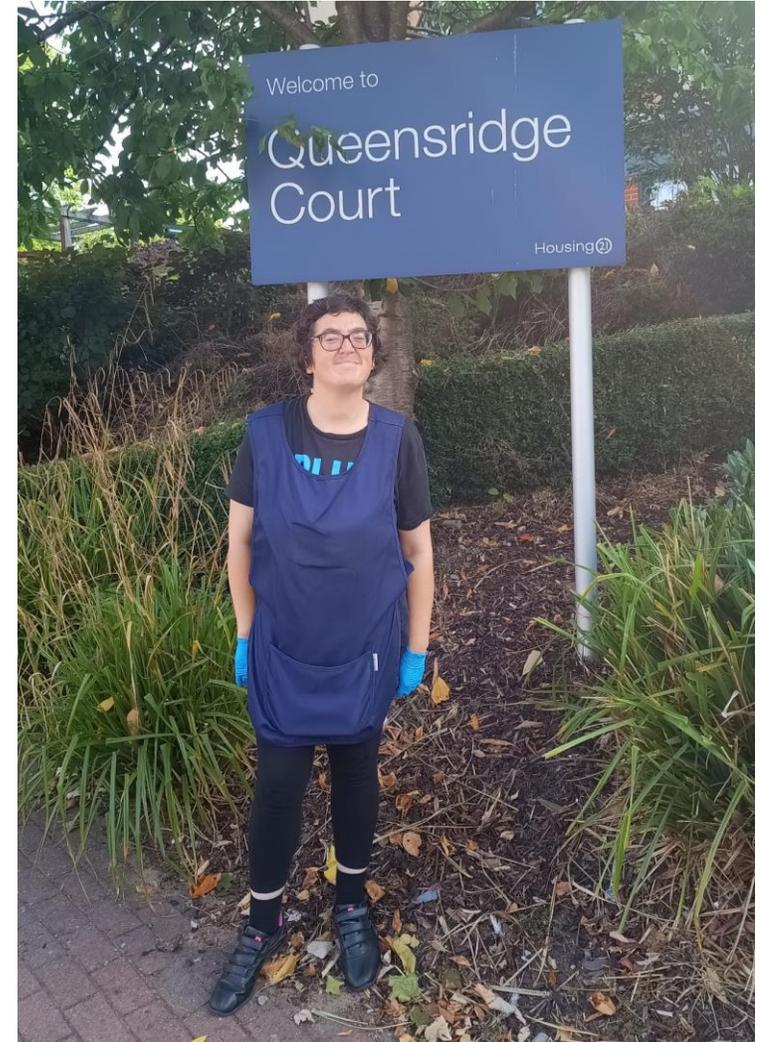
Since being referred to the Specialist Employment Team, Gemma has attended site visits and work tasters to increase her knowledge of different job roles and learn more about cleaning.

Supported Internship Programmes

This academic year **23** young Sandwell people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities are participating in supported internship programmes with employers across the Black Country.

Supported Internship programmes are structured, work-based study programmes facilitated by the support of an expert job coach and are for young people aged 16-24 with an Education Health and Care Plan.

In September, two new DFN Project sites opened at Asda Oldbury and Great Bridge stores. These opportunities complement existing supported internship programmes available with employers including Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Trust and Sandwell Council.
