- There are about 13,300 VCSE organisations in Warwickshire and Solihull
- 76% consider themselves small or micro sized
- 47% of organisations operate with no paid staff
- The average annual economic impact of volunteering is £129.3m






Key Aims

- Increase access to volunteering
- Increase flexible volunteering opportunities
- Build on volunteer pathways including employment
- Enable social action and place-based volunteering
- Better communicate the impact of volunteering







- 51% of organisations had not made significant changes to volunteer management
- Reduction of older people and those with complex health conditions who are volunteering
- Increased use of online recruitment and support
- Those that continued operating during the pandemic are likely to report a more diverse cohort













Highlights

- Access to the heritage, culture and green spaces of Solihull
- Targeted at refugees, asylum seekers and British Nationals Overseas
- High levels of satisfaction for all stakeholders

Challenges

- Sustainability and pathways

Challenges

- Increase in referrals for people with learning difficulties
- Organisation's capacity to support people with additional needs
- Reduction of staff since COVID Pandemic
- Lack of understanding on how to support people with learning needs.

Action

- 1 Week Inclusive Volunteering programme developed
- Partnership working between various stakeholders



Inclusive Volunteer Programme



Outcome

- Increased awareness of how to support people with learning difficulties in the voluntary sector
- 6 students placed in volunteering roles
- Volunteer recruitment process adapted



















SATURDADS IN RUGBY

Believe in children Barnardo's





"When we moved to Rugby in 2015 with our son, we didn't know anybody. My wife worked full time and I looked at quite a few sessions and it was a great way for my son and I to meet new people.

Generally I was the only Dad there, so I got in touch with Barnardo's about setting up a dads group. They were very enthusiastic about the idea and were extremely helpful in organising the whole process of setting up the group.

They put me in touch with another dad to share the running of the group which has made it really effective.

"The idea is to give male carers a Children Centre activity focused for them. It's been going well and proved popular, with some regulars and some new faces. The Centre has been a great resource for local Dads. When we started the group I was a first time Dad with a new baby. I was only expecting to make some new friends and have fun with my daughter.


As time has gone on we have created a safe space for male carers as well as a support network for each other. I feel really happy and proud that we have created a unique group in our area where dads can have fun with their little ones. The highlight for me has been watching confidences grow and the positive impact that has on relationships with children".

- We are working in partnership with other agencies to enable us to offer activities for the 5 years plus age range.
- Adult Community Learning have joined us to provide activities based around stories and also crafts to celebrate special occasions. At the same time as engaging the older children, they are able to introduce the Dads/Carers to their service.
- Rugby Art Gallery & Museum are also joining us to offer STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) activities. This week they brought along circuit boards and made gyroscopes, which proved very popular.
- Children North East have visited to talk to Dads/carers about their poverty proofing project. They spent time listening to where our families feel support is needed. They also spoke to children to gain the voice of the child.
- We are also in initial chats with CCFC MenTalk and other organisations, to widen the support for Dads/Male carers at our SaturDads sessions.

Where we are now...

- We have seen SaturDads grow from a regular cohort of 5 or 6 families to now having 30+ male carers attend with their children regularly. This is down to the hard work and dedication of our volunteers and Volunteer Coordinator.
- They have worked together to create something unique within Warwickshire area. They have gone from using one room in Centre to utilising the whole of the Claremont Children & Family Centre.
- They now provide indoors and outdoors activities in addition they use a Hall we have on site to provide a soft play session. They are also mindful of those with additional needs who may need a quieter zone and so keep a room available with bubble machine and sensory toys to escape to if needed.

Volunteer **Gardener at** Lighthorne **Heath Children** and Family Centre with additional needs



A volunteer was referred to Volunteer Coordinator through WCAVA, who had not been able to successfully find a volunteer opportunity as potential organisations were concerned about being able to accommodate his disability. Barnardo's had been looking for a volunteer to assist keeping the outdoor area at the C&FC at Lighthorne Heath tidy for families to access.

The Volunteer Coordinator spoke to the volunteer's mum who agreed to support him through training and provide translation with BSL where needed. When all 3 met up to complete training and visit the site, the idea of mum becoming a Barnardo's volunteer too was agreed upon to enable her to support with translation ongoing...
