


Population

In 2022 the population of Staffordshire stood at 886,300, a rise in the last 40 years of more than 15% from 765,300 in 1982. All but one district has seen a population rise in this period, but not all by the same amount or the same pace. In South Staffordshire the overall population has grown from 96,700 to 111,500.

However while there has been an overall rise this has been largely due to our ageing population and actually as you will see below the percentage of children aged 0-4 has actually fallen.

In South Staffordshire there has been a fall from 6,100 children aged 0-4 to 5,400 in 2022 compared to 1982. So now 4.4% of the population in the district is under 5 compared to 6.4% previously.



In 2023 831 babies were born in South Staffordshire.

- ⇒ Life expectancy higher for men and woman in South Staffordshire.
- ⇒ More than 93% of South Staffordshire residents are white.
- ⇒ House prices are similar to the England average and higher than Staffordshire.
- ⇒ Household income is higher in South Staffordshire than overall in Staffordshire.
- ⇒ More households in South Staffordshire own their own home compared to Staffordshire.
- ⇒ More families have access to a car than in Staffordshire and many areas are classed as rural
- ⇒ Only one in 10 children under five years live in the 20% most deprived postcodes in the UK. A fifth live in the 20% least deprived postcodes.

The table opposite shows the percentage of children achieving a GLD based on where they live in terms of the most to least deprived areas. 57% of children living in the 20% most deprived postcode areas achieved a good level of development (GLD) compared to 71% of those living in South Staffordshire overall. There were too few children living in the 10% most deprived area to be statistically robust.

In the 20% most deprived area only 35% of boys achieved a GLD compared to 62% in the least deprived area.

In total there was a 16 percentage point difference between the least and most deprived areas.



Think2 Take Up

Think2 has been in place for a number of years. Its aim to provide children aged two from a disadvantaged background with 15 hours per week (38 weeks) of high quality early education to ensure those children get the best start. Families are eligible if they are either not working or working and receiving a low income and would not otherwise be able to afford childcare. Since its rollout thousands of children in Staffordshire have benefitted.

Reading the data

As an authority we have children who attend Staffordshire settings who may not be Staffordshire children. We also have Staffordshire children attending settings not in the county ie in Stoke or Wolverhampton. Overall the numbers of children we 'import' and 'export' are broadly similar.

Take up by provider address - this is any child who is attending a Think2 place in that ward. This may not be a child who lives in the ward or even from the county. This is where the provider is based.


Take up by child address - This is a child who lives in Staffordshire and is attending a setting in Staffordshire. It may not be the same ward or district in which they live but is inside the county boundary.



Think2 Take Up

- \Rightarrow Take up in South Staffordshire has generally been above the target of 80%.
- ⇒ In autumn 2023 174 children living in South Staffordshire attended a Staffordshire setting to access Think2.
- ⇒ Overall in Staffordshire 24% of all two year olds are eligible for Think2. In South Staffordshire this is lower at 24%.
- ⇒ Eligibility among two year olds ranges from 61% in Featherstone down to 0% in Wombourne.





Take up in autumn 2023 for South Staffordshire was 84%

- ⇒ A lower number of children are admitted to hospital in South Staffordshire than elsewhere in the county.
- ⇒ Less children in South Staffordshire are overweight at four years old compared to Staffordshire.
- ⇒ A smaller number of babies are stillborn compared to the county average.
- ⇒ More mothers smoke in pregnancy in South Staffordshire than overall in Staffordshire.
- ⇒ A higher percentage of mothers breastfeed their babies in South Staffordshire compared to Staffordshire.
- ⇒ Less children have tooth decay or have had teeth extracted than nationally.
