## RE: Supervised toothbrushing and fluoride varnish programmes in schools and childcare settings

On 12<sup>th</sup> May <u>guidance</u> was issued to educational and childcare settings that from the week commencing 1 June 2020 at the earliest, primary schools will be asked to welcome back children in Nursery, Reception, year 1 and year 6, alongside priority groups. Supervised toothbrushing and fluoride varnish programmes that were in place for these age groups prior to school closures should not be reestablished at this time but suspended during the initial recovery period as schools adjust to the return of pupils. This would then be subject to review, in preparation for the reintroduction of the programmes in the autumn term.

These programmes are commissioned to support the most vulnerable children with the poorest oral health. In order to continue to support these children and families the distribution of toothbrushes and paste, either through schools or by post should be considered. In some areas this has already begun and has also been facilitated through other avenues for example via food banks.
