Safeguarding Updates

We have had a few concerns raised about settings who may have left some safeguarding practices slip during COVID-19. For example:

- Safer recruitment practices
- Timely sharing of safeguarding concerns
- Policies not followed through in practice
- Poor practice leading to children being at risk e.g. choking hazards

Some of this has had an impact on the wellbeing of children and has led to Ofsted visits and LADO investigations which have an impact on staff and setting reputation.

Please make sure that your policies are up to date and followed through in practice in your setting.

We are also aware of settings in some local authorities where settings have received an Inadequate rating as not all staff are aware of issues around Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) and child abuse linked to faith and belief – in particular, abuse linked to witchcraft and spirit possession. Although these cases are rare, it is crucial that staff are aware and can spot the signs and deal with any incidents appropriately. Please make sure that all staff have up to date safeguarding training and that they are all confident in their role and responsibilities in keeping children safe and supporting their wellbeing.

New government resource to help keep children safe from sexual abuse

It's estimated that one in ten children in England and Wales will experience sexual abuse before they turn sixteen. That's equivalent to three in every classroom.

Most children won't tell anyone at the time of their abuse. That's why it's important for everyone to know how to spot the potential signs of child sexual abuse and where to go for support if concerned. The government's new Stop Abuse Together website can help you learn to spot the signs and know when it's right to reach out for more support.

If you feel something's not right, you can call the NSPCC helpline on 0808 800 5000. No matter what's happened, there's always someone who will listen to you and take what you say seriously.

All children have a right to be safe from sexual abuse, and we all have a role to play in keeping them safe. Let's stop abuse together.
