Early Years Specialist Advisory Teachers

In the <u>Early Years Specialist Advisory Teaching Service</u>, we support colleagues in settings to ensure that children with additional needs experience a positive transition from home/preschool to reception. We provide advice, guidance and support to early years settings and schools. Settings can refer children to us for support, in consultation with parents/carers. Other teams, such as Portage, Fair Access or SENAT may also refer children to us, with parental permission.

SATS work with the 'SEND Under 5s' process to consider support for early years settings, children and their families, to help them plan for a successful transition to school.
