



Changes to Operation Encompass Notifications

Surrey and Sussex Police will be changing the way it shares Operation Encompass notifications with education establishments. In order to comply with governance around the sharing of personal data, notifications will be sent via an encrypted zip file which will require a unique password to open. For each notification two emails will be generated, one containing the encrypted file and the other a unique password to unprotect the document.

Why are the changes being made?

Guidance from The Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) and force policy recommends that all personal data shared outside of the organisation should be sent encrypted to maintain the integrity

What action is required?

In preparation for the changes we are asking DSL leads to contact their IT departments to make them aware of these changes and advise them of the requirements below:

- •Emails will be sent via the submitting Officer's email address. E.g. joseph.bloggs@sussex.police.uk or joseph.bloggs@surrey.police.uk.
- •To access the encrypted files using the password, computers will need software which will open password encrypted zip files, such as 7-Zip. These applications are widely used by many organisations worldwide. The Windows extract function will NOT open these documents.
