| 9:00AM—10:30AM | Vernal, UT: Vernal & Uintah County's Innovation Hub
The Hub is a combo coworking center, rural online center, entrepreneur center, business incubator and business resource. The purpose of the center is to help and encourage the diversification of our Basin economy, connect entrepreneurs, provide business training and encourage our meager tech industry to grow. |
| 9:00AM—10:30AM | South Jordan, UT: Daybreak Transportation Tour
Bicycle tour of active transportation facilities of Daybreak and surrounding areas. |
| 9:00AM | Spanish Fork, UT: New All Abilities Park
This park is designed to have something for everyone, regardless of their abilities. See sensory gardens, zip lines and adaptable swings. Also learn what special materials were required to make the park truly accessible to all. Tour led by Dale Robinson, Spanish Fork Parks and Recreation Director. |
| 10:00AM—12:00PM | Orem, UT: Prep60 Hydro Power Facility—Olmsted Hydropower Plant |
| 1:00PM—2:00PM | Springdale, UT: Tour new culinary water treatment plant
The plant is an 810 gpm conventional filtration plant that provides culinary water to the residents and visitors of the Town of Springdale. The water treatment plant is a critical piece of infrastructure in taking water from the Virgin River and treating it for culinary use. |
| 1:00PM-2:30PM | Utah State University: Innovation Campus
From Utah State University dorms to Logan's waste water treatment center, learn about tracking and containing COVID-19 outbreaks through innovation in sewage monitoring with biological engineering professor Keith Roper. New sewage monitoring procedures can help municipalities stay healthy and safe. Learn how this technology could potentially help communities detect influenza or other communicable diseases in the future. |
| 1:00PM-3:00PM | Visit Historic Spring City
Travel back in time and tour Spring City. Also known as "Little Denmark", Spring City is widely considered the best preserved example of a 19th Century Pioneer Village. It is one of just two cities in the United States to have its entire city limits listed as a historic district on the National Register of History Places. Mayor Cynthia Allred DeGrey will lead the tour and is a lifelong resident. Learn about Spring City's art community and visit Horseshoe Mountain Pottery. Also see Town Hall, peek inside the beautiful Rock Chapel, historic D.U.P. Museums, and possible home tours. Mayor DeGrey, will also discuss the new 700 acre multi-purpose reservoir that will benefit their city. Remember to bring a few water bottles to capture free, sparkling water. |
| 2:00PM—3:00PM | Holladay, UT: Holladay City Tour
Tour Holladay City's City Hall/Park redevelopment, Village Plaza and overview of infrastructure changes. The tour will also highlight housing, public process, the SoHo Food Truck Park and upcoming proposals in, and around the area. Learn about Holladay City's Tree Committee, its purpose and goals. |
| 2:00PM—3:00PM | North Salt Lake, UT: City of North Salt Lake Town Center Master Plan
The mobile tour will highlight the implementation of the City of North Salt Lake Town Center Master Plan, including future implementation of a BRT line, redevelopment projects along Highway 89 from I-15 off ramp to 350 N, including mixed use developments Village Station, City's Edge, Williamsburg, Towne Plaza and NSL City Center, as well as the major redevelopment planned for Hatch Park. Learn how the city is creating a vibrant center and implementing the plan and the lessons learned about development agreements. |

9:30AM-10:30AM	<p>Ogden, UT: Monarch Tour</p> <p>Take a behind-the-scenes tour of The Monarch with Thaine Fischer, Managing Planner. After a massive historic renovation, The Monarch opened on 25th Street in November 2019. The collaborative environment is where artists, creative businesses and makers of all types can connect, inspire, and create together in the heart of Ogden's Nine Rails Creative District. Throughout the pandemic, the artists have shown to be the greatest strength to the enterprise. All 41 studios are full and there is a robust wait list for studio space openings.</p>
11:00AM—11:45AM	<p>Ogden, UT: Utah Energy Wise Communities Project</p> <p>The Energy Wise Ogden Strategic Implementation Plan was adopted by the city to reduce energy waste and improve resilience across all sectors of the city. The plan lays out goals, strategies, and timeliness to significantly reduce energy waste in Ogden's municipal operations, businesses, and residential areas. Presentation by Kevin Emerson with Utah Clean Air at Ogden City Hall</p>
12:00PM—12:30PM	Ogden, UT: "Make Ogden" - Ogden's New Downtown Master Plan
1:30PM—2:30PM	<p>Ogden, UT: Union Station</p> <p>See the new exhibit, "Beyond Suffrage: A Century of Northern Utah Women Making History" presented by Weber State University Stewart Library and the Museums at Union Station. Also learn about Union Station Foundation's revitalization plans with Executive Director Michael Plowman.</p>
1:00PM—3:00PM	<p>Park City, UT: Kimball Junction Master Plan & Olympic Park Improvements</p> <p>Learn about Kimball Junction Master Plan and long range transportation plan for the area from Summit County planners. 4:00PM—5:30PM	<p>South Salt Lake, UT: South Salt Lake Revitalization of 3900 South</p> <p>South Salt Lake "rediscovered" itself in the process of master planning for a new downtown, with entertainment, dining, businesses, in an industrial area that seemed to be a blank slate, it found many lively and thriving businesses eager to help shape the area and preserve its funkiness and vibe. Working with the South Salt Lake Arts Council, they developed a plan for "creative placemaking" and to shape an identity that they call the Creative Industry Zone. Today, the neighborhood is known for art studios, breweries and distilleries, and Muralfest. The walking tour of South Salt Lake's re-development zone with Sharen Hauri, SSL Urban Design, Leslie Allen, SSL Arts Council, and Sean Lewis, SSL Community Development.
