Do You Know If You're Eligible?

Refer to page 7-8 in the [RFA](#)

- In order to be eligible for PCF, practices must:
 - Be located in one of the **26 PCF regions**, eight of which are former CPC+ regions
 - Provide health services to at least **125 Medicare beneficiaries**
 - Have **experience with value-based payment** arrangements
- Both CPC+ and Non-CPC+ practices are eligible
- Practices are **not** eligible if they are a rural health clinic or a FQHC

Want More Information on Risk Groups?

- Practices will be divided into **four risk groups** based on the average hierarchical condition category (HCC) risk score of their attributed Medicare beneficiaries
- Quality measures vary depending on risk group, with one set for those in Risk Groups 1 and 2 and a separate set for practices in Risk Groups 3 and 4
- Risk Group will impact payment, described below; however, the flat visit fee (\$40.82) will be the same in all risk groups
- If selected, your practice will receive preliminary estimates of your projected risk group along with an estimated number of attributed beneficiaries. Practices will have an opportunity to review this information before signing a Participation Agreement (PA)

Questions on Payment Methodology?

- The total primary care payment is **calculated on a quarterly basis**. It includes two main payment types: (1) a **population-based payment (PBP)** and (2) a **flat visit fee**. The PBP amount aligns to risk group
- If a practice meets **key performance standards**, they are eligible to receive an adjustment to their total primary care payment up to 50% through the Performance-Based Adjustment (PBA)
- CMS applies a **quarterly leakage adjustment** to reconcile the population-based payment when less than 100% of primary care services are delivered at a practice over a given year. This adjustment will first take effect in 2023 Quarter 3 based on services provided in 2022

Understand Care Delivery Requirements?

- Care Delivery reporting will **occur annually**
- The **care delivery requirements in PCF will look similar to those in CPC+** as the primary care functions remain the same between both models; however, the PCF requirements are less prescriptive
- Practices will be **given flexibility** under the model to use their own individualized approaches to care delivery as long as they satisfy a **minimum threshold of care delivery requirements including:**
 - Provide 24/7 access to a care team practitioner with real-time access to the EHR
 - Provide risk-stratified care management
 - Ensure all PCF Beneficiaries receive timely follow-up contact from the PCF Practice after ED visits and hospitalizations
 - Integrate behavioral health into primary care services
 - Assess and support patients' psychosocial needs
 - Implement a regular process for PCF Beneficiaries and caregivers to advise PCF Practice improvement
 - Set goals and continuously improve upon key outcome measures

***Note:** There are a couple of additional requirements for practices in Risk Groups 3 and 4 (refer to [Page 15 in the RFA](#) for information on these requirements)
