## U.S. EXPORT SALES

THIS REPORT IS BASED ON INDIVIDUAL REPORTS SUBMITTED BY PRIVATE EXPORTERS AND IDENTIFIES OUTSTANDING SALES AND ACCUMULATED EXPORTS OF SELECTED U.S. AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES. THE REPORT IS PUBLISHED WEEKLY, NORMALLY ON THURSDAY MORNING AT 8:30 A.M.

OUTSTANDING EXPORT SALES AS REPORTED AND COMPILED WITH OTHER DATA GIVE A SNAPSHOT VIEW OF THE CURRENT CONTRACTING SCENE. AT ANY GIVEN TIME IN THE COURSE OF A MARKETING YEAR, OUTSTANDING SALES DO NOT BEAR A CONSISTENT RELATIONSHIP TO EVENTUAL EXPORT SHIPMENTS. A MEANINGFUL EXPORT PROJECTION IS NOT OBTAINABLE BY SIMPLY ADDING OUTSTANDING SALES TO EXPORTS TO DATE. THE LATTER DATA, ALONE, PROVIDE A MORE RELIABLE MEASURE OF CURRENT EXPORT ACTIVITY THAN MAY BE DERIVED FROM A YEAR-TO-YEAR COMPARISON OF OUTSTANDING SALES.

THIS REPORT INCLUDES ALL COUNTRIES WITH OUTSTANDING SALES OR ACCUMULATED EXPORTS FOR EACH CLASS OF WHEAT, ALL WHEAT, WHEAT PRODUCTS, BARLEY, CORN, SORGHUM, SOYBEANS, SOYBEAN CAKE AND MEAL, SOYBEAN OIL, SUNFLOWERSEED OIL, AMERICAN PIMA COTTON, ALL UPLAND COTTON, ALL RICE, CATTLE HIDES AND SKINS, WET BLUES, BEEF, AND PORK. ## Export Sales Highlights

This summary is based on reports from exporters for the period March 9-15, 2018.
Wheat: Net sales of 265,200 metric tons for delivery in marketing year 2017/2018 were up 63 percent from the previous week, but down 1 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were for Taiwan (94,300 MT), Nigeria (49,500 MT, including 45,000 MT switched from unknown destinations), unknown destinations (40,500 MT), Japan (33,700 MT), and the Philippines (19,400 MT, including 21,000 MT switched from unknown destinations and decreases of $1,600 \mathrm{MT}$ ). Reductions were reported for Mexico (13,700 MT), Jamaica ( 7,800 MT), Panama (2,000 MT), and Nicaragua (1,200 MT). For 2018/2019, net sales of 163,400 MT were primarily reported for Mexico ( 44,600 MT), the Dominican Republic ( 40,000 MT), unknown destinations ( 28,700 MT), and the United Kingdom ( 27,000 MT). Exports of 472,800 MT were up 41 percent from the previous week and 31 percent from the prior 4 -week average. The primary destinations were to Morocco (94,100 MT), South Korea (72,400 MT), Nigeria (49,500 MT), Thailand (49,300 MT), and Japan (48,600 MT).

Corn: Net sales of 1,470,200 MT for 2017/2018 were down 41 percent from the previous week and 23 percent from the prior 4 -week average. Increases were reported for South Korea ( 449,200 MT, including 68,000 MT switched from Panama, 61,800 MT switched from unknown destinations, and decreases of 3,400 MT), Japan ( $263,100 \mathrm{MT}$, including 156,400 MT switched from unknown destinations and decreases 3,700 MT), Taiwan (194,600 MT), Mexico (178,200 MT, including decreases of 6,600 MT), and China (98,800 MT). Reductions were reported for Panama ( 157,100 MT), unknown destinations ( $87,600 \mathrm{MT}$ ), and the Dominican Republic (1,300 MT). For 2018/2019, net sales reductions of 14,500 MT resulted as increases for El Salvador (5,500 MT), were more than offset by reductions for Colombia ( $20,000 \mathrm{MT}$ ). Exports of 1,375,300 MT were down 2 percent from the previous week, but up 20 percent from the prior 4-week average. The destinations were primarily to Japan (276,000 MT), South Korea (270,300 MT), Mexico (194,600 MT), Colombia (110,500 MT), and Saudi Arabia (72,800 MT).
Optional Origin Sales: For 2017/2018, new optional origin sales of 278,000 MT were reported for South Korea. Options were exercised to export 68,000 MT to South Korea from the United States. The current optional origin outstanding balance of 846,000 MT is for South Korea (414,000 MT), unknown destinations (246,000 MT), and Vietnam (186,000 MT).

Barley: Net sales of 1,600 MT were up noticeably from the previous week, but down 57 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were reported for Canada (1,100 MT) and Taiwan (500 MT). Exports of 500 MT were reported to Japan ( 300 MT) and Taiwan (200 MT).

Sorghum: Net sales reductions of 35,800 MT for 2017/2018 resulted as increases for China ( $11,200 \mathrm{MT}$, including 66,000 MT switched from unknown destinations and decreases of $65,000 \mathrm{MT}$ ) and Japan ( $10,000 \mathrm{MT}$ ), were more than offset by reductions for unknown destinations ( $57,000 \mathrm{MT}$ ). Exports of $249,600 \mathrm{MT}$ were up 34 percent from the previous week and 15 percent from the prior 4-week average. The destinations were China (249,400 MT) and South Korea (200 MT).

Rice: Net sales of 106,300 MT for 2017/2018 were up noticeably from the previous week and up 64 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were reported for Libya (29,800 MT), Mexico (23,100 MT), Haiti (22,500 MT), Venezuela (12,100 MT), and Guatemala ( $5,800 \mathrm{MT}$ ). Exports of 98,200 MT were up 57 percent from the previous week and 49 percent from the prior 4 -week average. The primary destinations were Mexico (32,800 MT), Libya (29,800 MT), Venezuela (12,100 MT), Honduras (10,300 MT), and El Salvador (6,500 MT).

Exports for Own Account: The current outstanding balance of 100 MT is for Canada.
Soybeans: Net sales of 759,000 MT for 2017/2018 were down 40 percent from the previous week and 33 percent from the prior 4 -week average. Increases were reported for China ( $324,800 \mathrm{MT}$, including $63,000 \mathrm{MT}$ switched from unknown destinations and decreases of 5,800 MT), Taiwan ( $82,500 \mathrm{MT}$, including decreases 1,300 MT), Japan (79,300 MT, including 9,700 MT switched from unknown destinations and decreases of 16,900 MT), the Netherlands ( $70,300 \mathrm{MT}$, including 66,000 MT switched from unknown destinations), and Mexico ( $63,200 \mathrm{MT}$, including decreases 1,700 MT). Reductions were reported for unknown destinations (22,700 MT). For 2018/2019, net sales of 140,000 MT were reported for unknown destinations (139,500 MT) and Thailand ( 500 MT). Exports of 548,700 MT--a marketing-year low--were down 39 percent from the previous week and 41 percent from the prior 4 -week average. The primary destinations were China (130,900 MT), the Netherlands (70,300 MT), Egypt (65,500 MT), Mexico (61,100 MT), and Japan (56,900 MT).

Export for Own Account: The current outstanding balance of 12,200 MT is for Canada.
Soybean Cake and Meal: Net sales of 194,600 MT for 2017/2018 were up 12 percent from the previous week and 21 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were reported for the Philippines (48,700 MT), Guatemala (35,700 MT, including 18,200 MT switched from Honduras, 8,300 MT switched from unknown destinations, and decreases of 300 MT ), Thailand ( $30,000 \mathrm{MT}$ ), unknown destinations ( $26,800 \mathrm{MT}$ ), and Mexico ( $10,000 \mathrm{MT}$ ). Reductions were reported for Honduras ( $17,200 \mathrm{MT}$ ), Colombia ( 900 MT ), and Costa Rica (700 MT). For 2018/2019, net sales of 800 MT were reported for Guatemala ( $6,600 \mathrm{MT}$ ), Malaysia ( 600 MT ) and Canada ( 200 MT), were partially offset by reductions for Honduras ( $6,600 \mathrm{MT}$ ). Reductions were reported for Honduras ( $6,600 \mathrm{MT}$ ). Exports of 147,500 MT were down 46 percent from the previous week and 50 percent from the prior 4-week average. The primary destinations were Mexico (22,000 MT), Japan (21,700 MT), Canada (13,900 MT), Peru (10,700 MT), and Colombia (10,600 MT).

Soybean Oil: Net sales of 36,500 MT were up 16 percent from the previous week and 17 percent from the prior 4-week average.

Increases were reported for unknown destinations (30,000 MT), the Dominican Republic (8,900 MT), and Mexico (1,900 MT). Reductions were reported for Colombia (4,400 MT). Exports of 11,500 MT were down 44 percent from the previous week and 28 percent from the prior 4-week average. The primary destinations were Guatemala (6,400 MT) and Mexico (5,000 MT).

Cotton: Net sales of 338,400 running bales for 2017/2018 were up 5 percent from the previous week, but down 3 percent from the prior 4week average. Increases were reported for Bangladesh ( $71,100 \mathrm{RB}$ ), Vietnam ( $65,300 \mathrm{RB}$, including 300 RB switched from China, 200 RB switched from Japan, and decreases of 100 RB), South Korea ( 50,800 RB, including 7,200 RB switched from China), Turkey (28,300 RB), and Hong Kong (22,100 RB). Reductions were reported for Switzerland (3,500 RB), Japan (800 RB), and India (100 RB). For 2018/2019, net sales of 147,500 RB were primarily for Vietnam ( $65,200 \mathrm{RB}$ ), South Korea ( $27,700 \mathrm{RB}$ ), and Mexico ( $15,000 \mathrm{RB}$ ). Exports of 425,100 RB were up 3 percent from the previous week and 10 percent from the prior 4-week average. The primary destinations were Vietnam ( $80,200 \mathrm{RB}$ ), Pakistan ( $76,900 \mathrm{RB}$ ), China ( $67,800 \mathrm{RB}$ ), Turkey ( $37,900 \mathrm{RB}$ ), and Indonesia ( $34,200 \mathrm{RB}$ ). Net sales of Pima totaling 4,100 RB for 2017/2018 were down 45 percent from the previous week and 36 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were primarily reported for Peru ( $1,900 \mathrm{RB}$, including decreases of 100 RB ), India ( $1,400 \mathrm{RB}$ ), China ( 900 RB , switched from Hong Kong), and Honduras ( 500 RB). Reductions were reported for Hong Kong ( 900 RB), Switzerland ( 400 RB), and Japan (200 RB). For 2018/2019, net sales of 700 RB were reported for India. Exports of 19,700 RB were down 23 percent from the previous week and 9 percent from the prior 4 -week average. The primary destinations were China ( $5,600 \mathrm{RB}$ ), India ( $5,500 \mathrm{RB}$ ), Vietnam ( $4,400 \mathrm{RB}$ ), and Austria (1,000 RB).

Optional Origin Sales: For 2017/2018, the current optional origin outstanding balance is $16,500 \mathrm{RB}$, all Indonesia.
Exports for Own Account: New exports for own account totaling 1,500 RB were primarily to Indonesia (1,000 RB). Exports to Vietnam ( $8,000 \mathrm{RB}$ ), Indonesia (300 RB), and China (200 RB) were applied to new or outstanding sales. Decreases totaling 400 RB were reported for Indonesia. The current outstanding balance of $19,000 \mathrm{RB}$ is for Vietnam (10,300 RB), Indonesia (4,400 RB), China (3,800 RB), and Bangladesh (500 RB).

Hides and Skins: Net sales of 220,900 pieces reported for 2018 were down 39 percent from the previous week and 38 percent from the prior 4-week average. Whole cattle hide sales totaling 220,500 pieces were primarily for China ( 153,000 pieces, including decreases of 16,400 pieces), South Korea ( 24,700 pieces, including decreases of 1,400 pieces), Taiwan (19,500 pieces, including decreases of 400 pieces), Mexico (10,900 pieces, including decreases of 3,200 pieces), and Slovenia ( 7,200 pieces). Reductions were reported for Thailand (1,900 pieces) and Indonesia ( 700 pieces). Exports of 330,800 pieces reported for 2018 were up 3 percent from the previous week, but down 9 percent from the prior 4 -week average. Whole cattle hide exports of 320,500 pieces were primarily to China ( 169,000 pieces), South Korea (59,100 pieces), Thailand ( 34,100 pieces), Mexico (27,500 pieces), and Taiwan (7,000 pieces).

Net sales of 41,700 wet blues for 2018 were up 3 percent from the previous week, but down 57 percent from the prior 4 -week average. Increases were reported for China (22,100 unsplit and 5,700 grain splits), South Korea (5,200 grain splits), and Vietnam (3,400 unsplit). Reductions were reported for Thailand (1,600 grain splits), Japan (1,400 unsplit), and Taiwan (100 unsplit). Exports of 75,000 wet blues for 2018 were down 35 percent from the previous week and 34 percent from the prior 4-week average. The primary destinations were Italy ( 23,400 unsplit and 2,800 grain splits), China ( 7,000 unsplit and 5,700 grain splits), and Mexico ( 9,600 grain splits and 800 unsplit). Net sales splits totaling of 317,100 pounds for 2018 were reported for China ( 311,100 pounds) and South Korea (6,000 pounds). Exports of 657,000 pounds were up noticeably from the previous week and up 67 percent from the prior 4 -week average. The destinations were Vietnam (483,000 pounds), China (150,000 pounds), and South Korea (24,000 pounds).

Beef: Net sales of 6,000 MT for 2018--a marketing-year low--were down 70 percent from the previous week and 66 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were primarily for South Korea (2,500 MT, including decreases of 400 MT), Taiwan (1,800 MT, including decreases of 100 MT ), and Mexico ( $1,700 \mathrm{MT}$, including decreases of 100 MT ). Reductions were reported for Japan (2,700 MT). Exports of 16,700 MT were up 10 percent from the previous week and 7 percent from the prior 4-week average. The primary destinations were Japan (5,700 MT), South Korea (4,300 MT), Hong Kong (2,000 MT), Mexico (1,400 MT), and Taiwan (1,200 MT).

Pork: Net sales of 19,500 MT for 2018 were down 38 percent from the previous week and 31 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were reported for Mexico (5,000 MT), South Korea (4,000 MT), Japan (3,600 MT), Australia (1,700 MT), and Canada (1,100 MT). Exports of $24,100 \mathrm{MT}$ were down 3 percent from the previous week and 1 percent from the prior 4-week average. The primary destinations were Mexico (8,000 MT), South Korea (5,100 MT), Japan (3,900 MT), Canada (1,800 MT), and Colombia (1,200 MT).
