

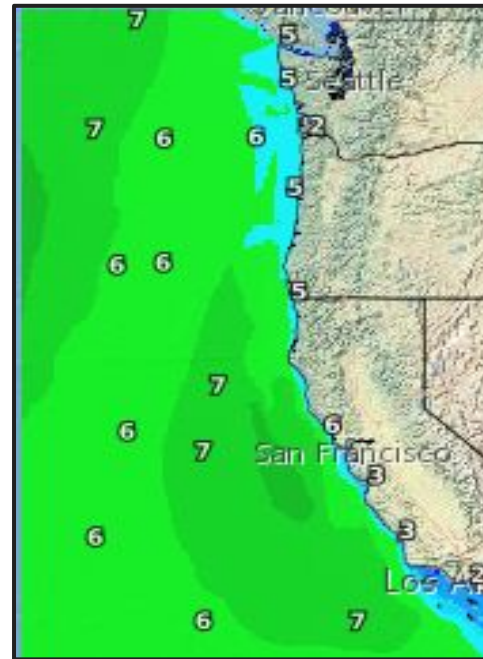


KEY MESSAGES:

- A cold front will near the northern waters on Friday then stall and weaken west of the area.
- Winds will increase ahead of the front to 20-30 kts on Fri then improve into Fri night as the front weakens.
- Seas of 6-8 ft are expected across much of the area.

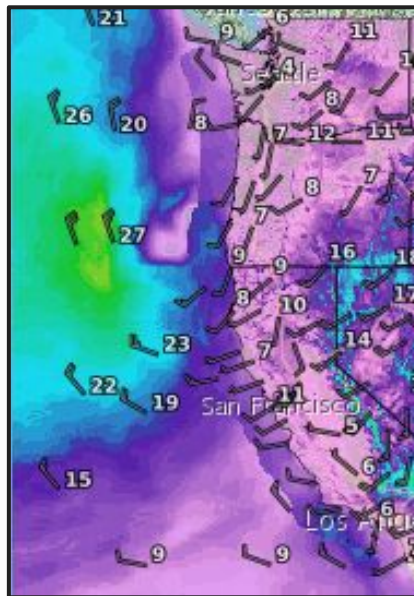
Area to Watch

Monday into Monday night (5/12)

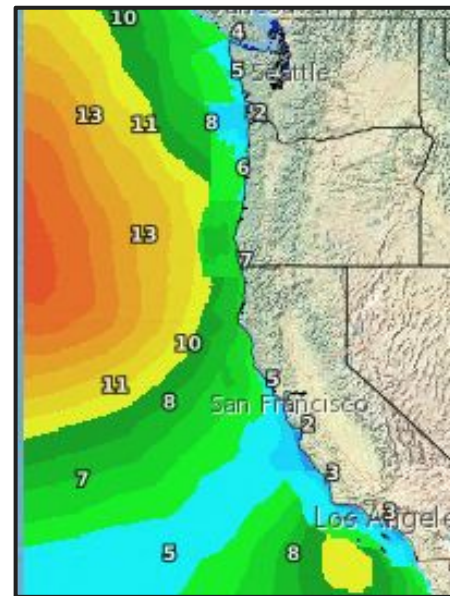

KEY MESSAGES:

- Low pressure will move SE into the Oregon and Northern California waters Monday while pushing a cold front through the California waters.
- Winds will increase behind the low with 20 to 30 kt winds affecting the central and northern California, and Oregon waters Monday and Monday night. Gale force winds will be possible.
- Large swell of 10 - 18 ft will overspread the outer waters Monday and continue move S and E into Mon night. Conditions will improve Tue as the low weakens and winds diminish.
