



The Response to Suspicious Behaviors and Items for Bombing Prevention Awareness course is designed to highlight appropriate responses to potential terrorist or criminal activity by differentiating between normal and abnormal behaviors. This course also discusses the differences between unattended and suspicious items as well as the associated responses.

Who Should Attend

Managers, and employees of stores that sell homemade explosive precursors; facility managers; and public and private sector emergency management representatives, security professionals, and law enforcement.

Course Delivery Methods

This one hour course is delivered primarily through online Virtual Instructor-Led Training (VILT) conducted with a live instructor, using the Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN). Under certain circumstances it may also be provided in-person as part of a tailored program delivery.
