




Convective Outlook Days 1-3






Fire Weather Outlook






Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day





Hazard Outlook April 8-12









- Voluntary evacuations in effect

- FEMA Region VII RWC remains at Watch/Steady State



- Fire began on April 5, 2016, and is burning on state and private land
- Threatening homes in and around Freedom (population 289) in Woods County; 500 homes and 50 mixed commercial/residential structures threatened in Woods and Woodward counties
- Also threatening businesses, wildlife, roads, infrastructure, utilities, and equipment
- Voluntary/mandatory evacuations in effect for 400 residents
- One shelter open w/ 2 occupants

<u>Response:</u>

- OK EOC remains at Normal Operations
- FEMA Region VI RWC remains at Watch/Steady State
- FMAG approved April 5, 2016
