Event Summary

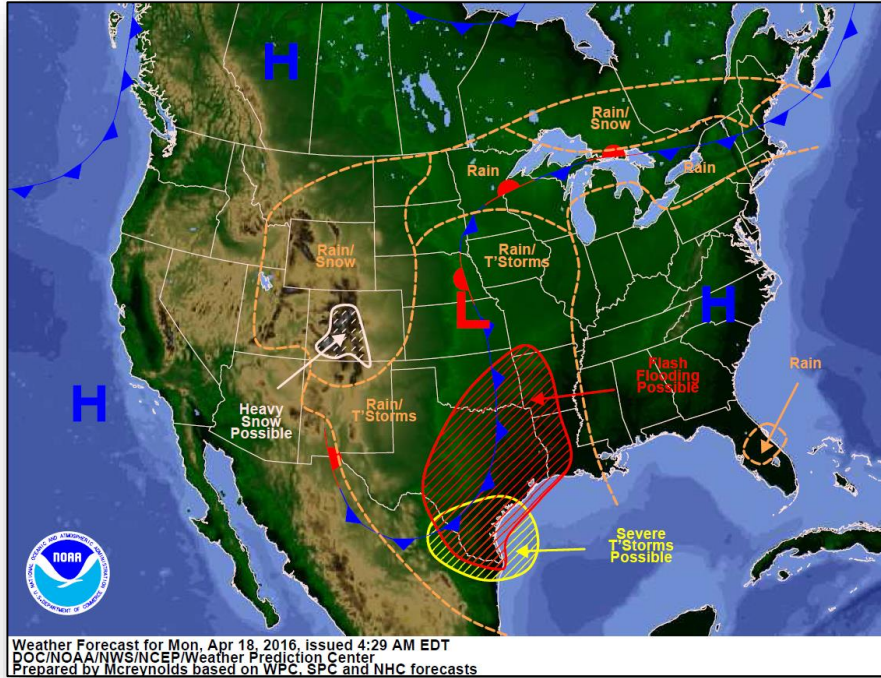
- Designated a Special Event Assessment Rating (SEAR) 2

- 120th running of the world's oldest annual marathon

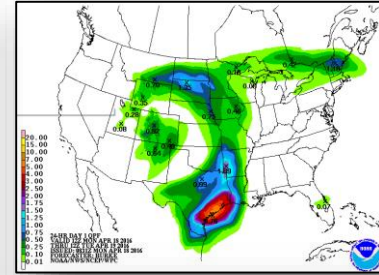
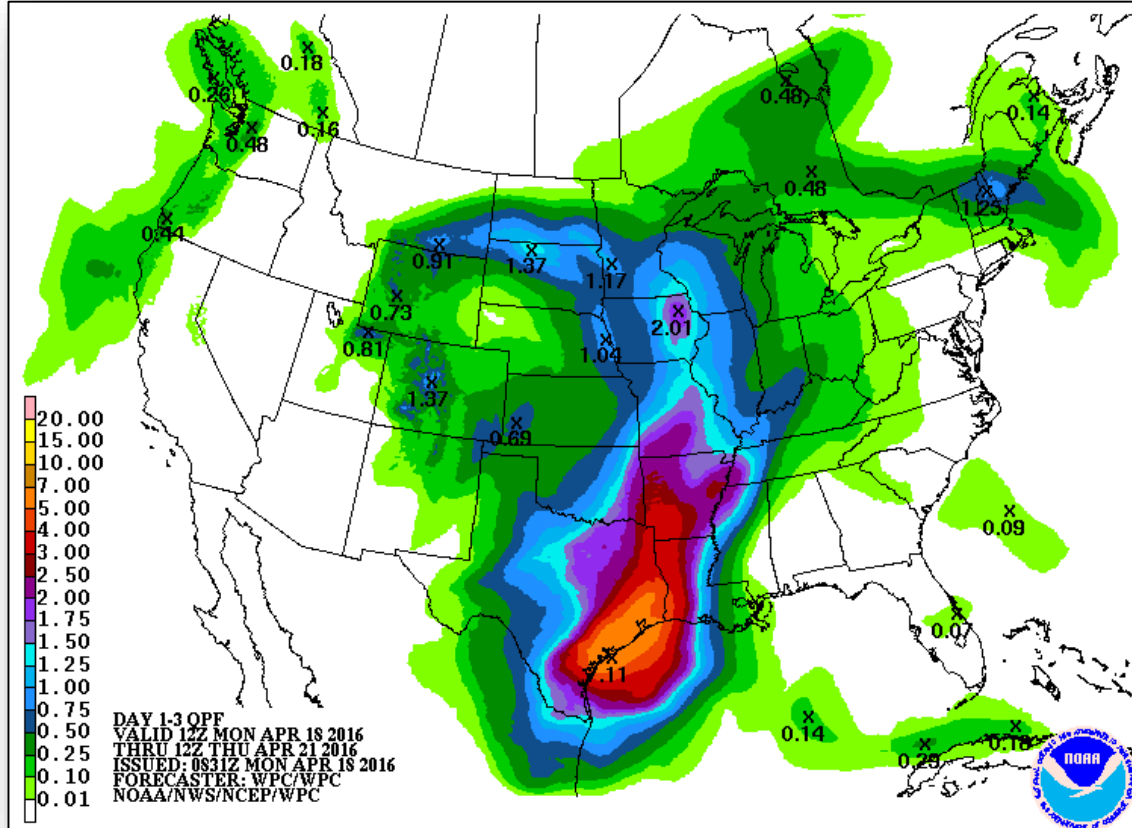
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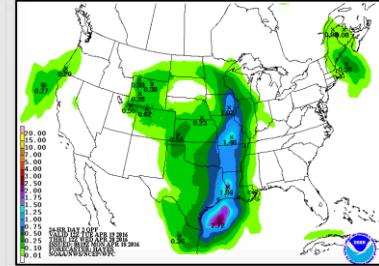
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



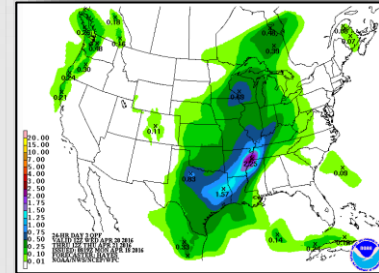

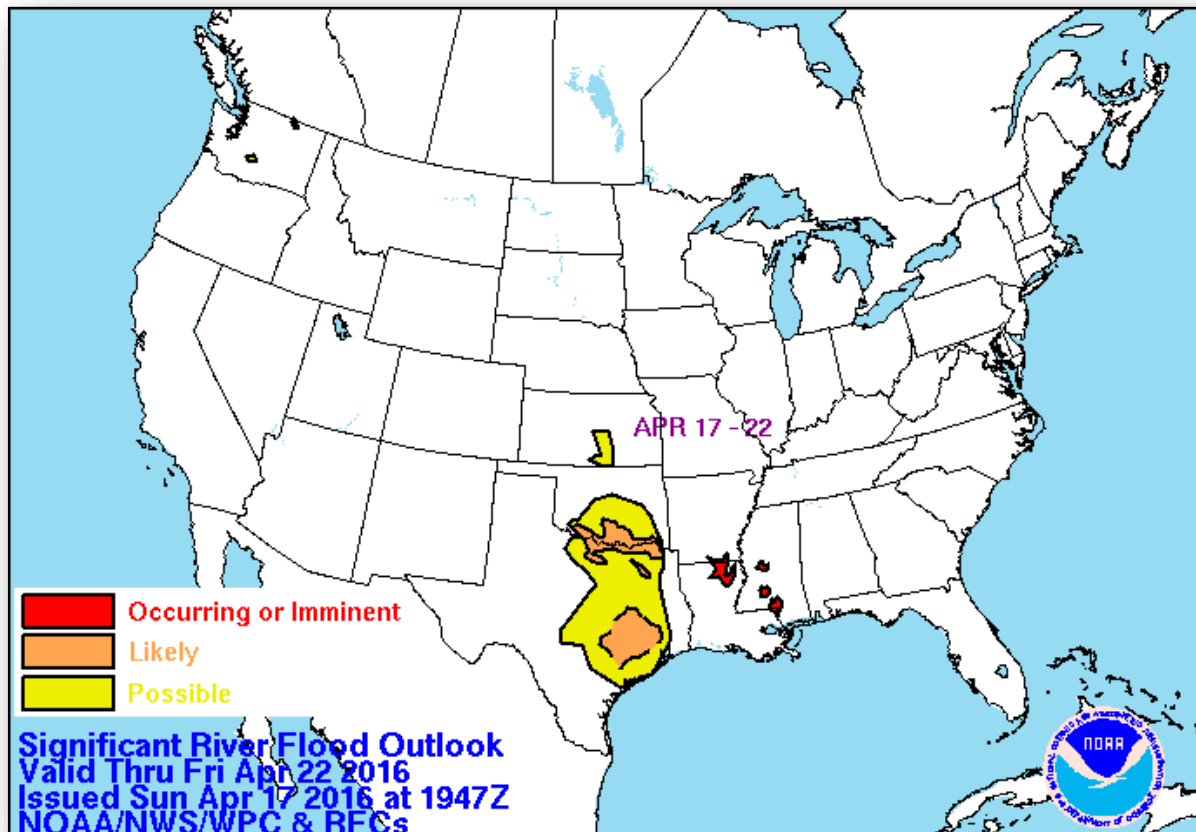
Flash Flood Potential



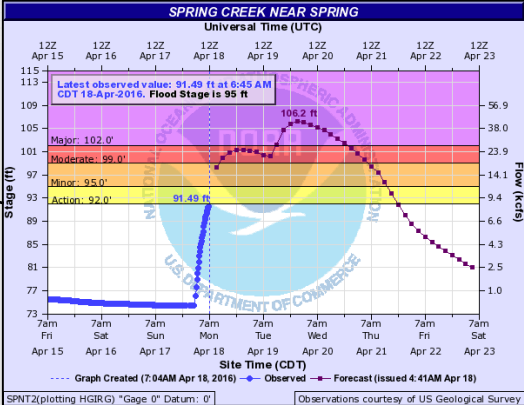
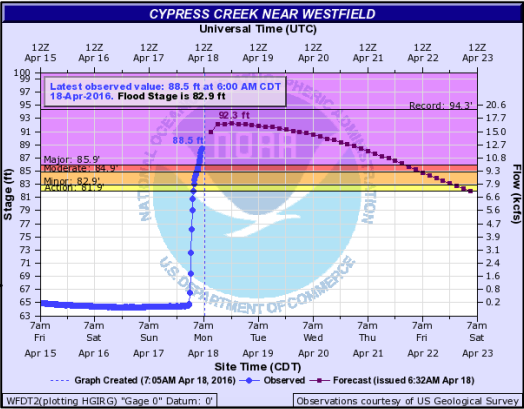
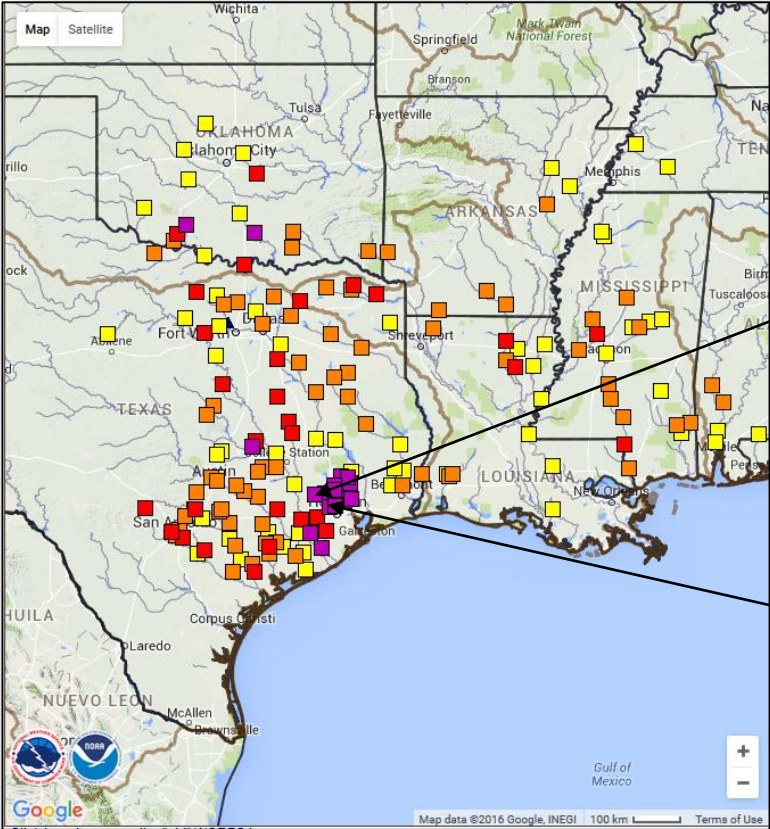
Significant River Flood Outlook



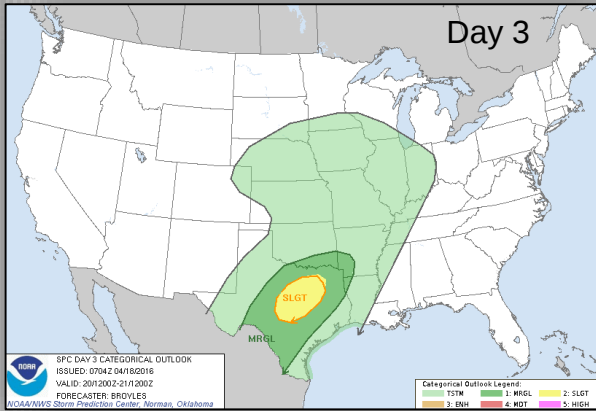
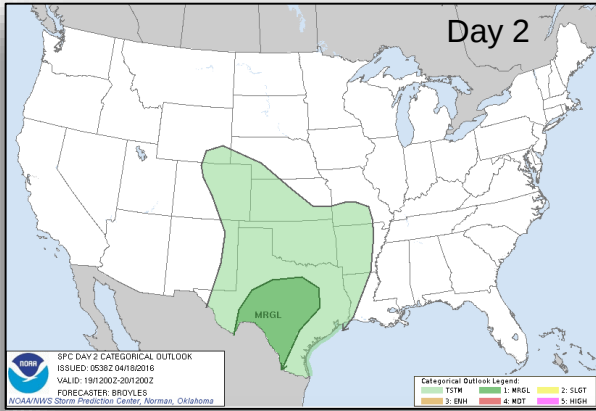
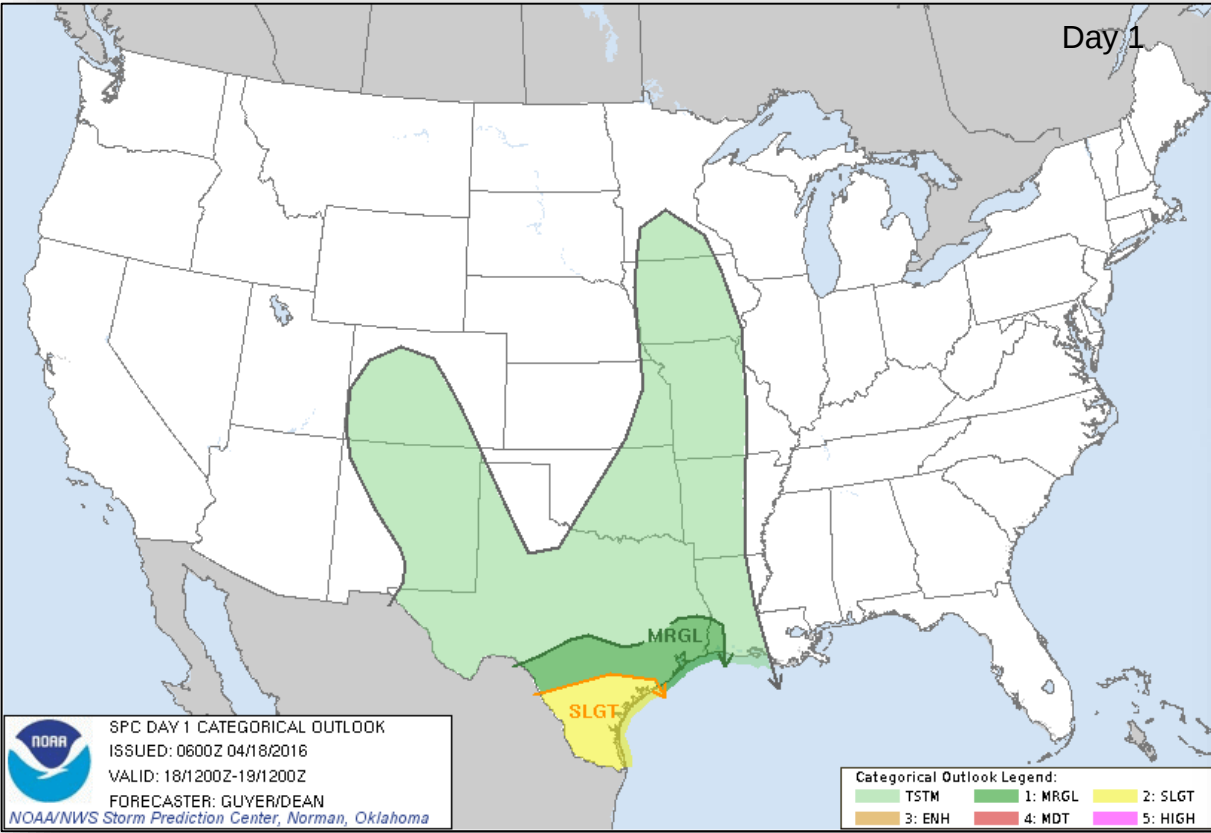
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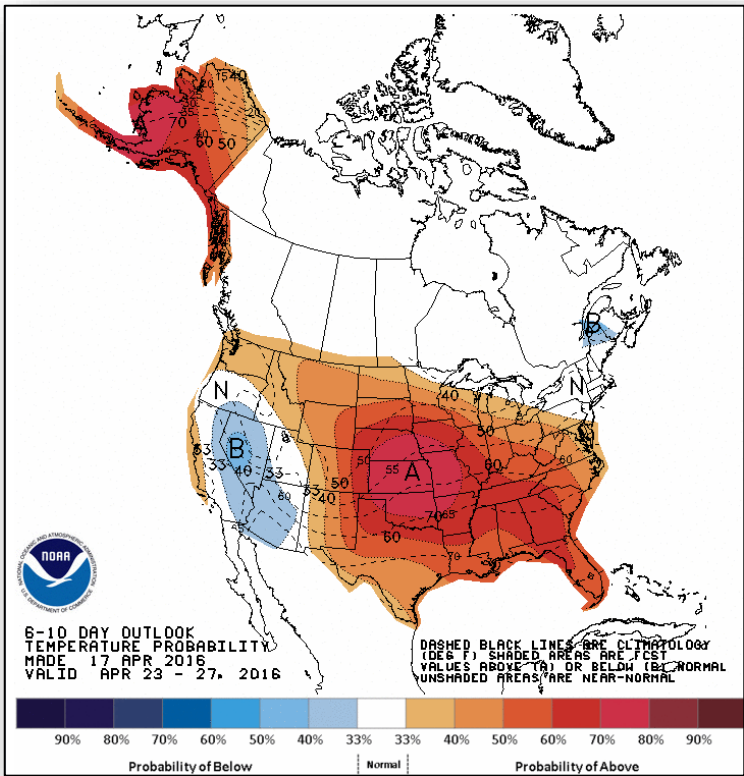

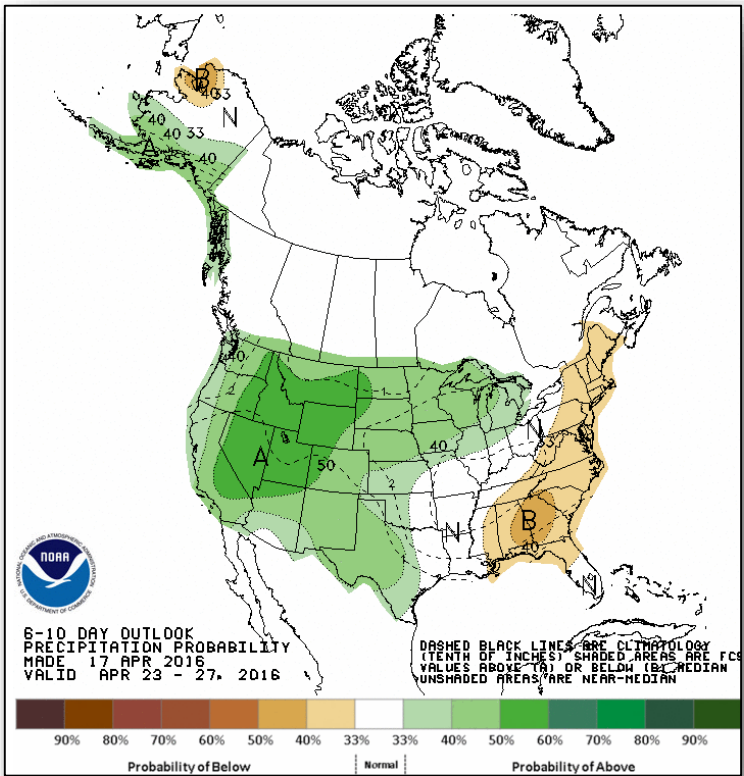
Convective Outlook Days 1-3

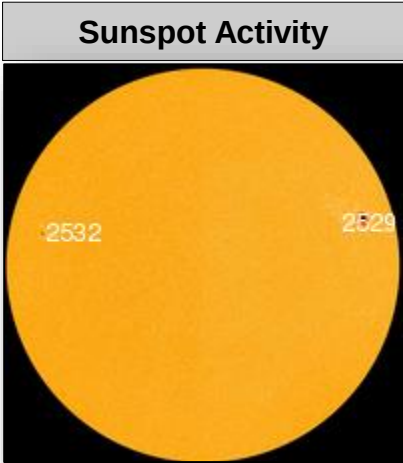
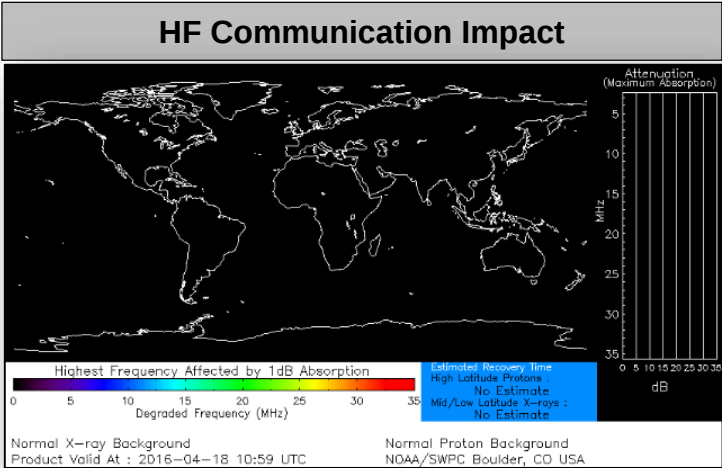
Temperature Probability

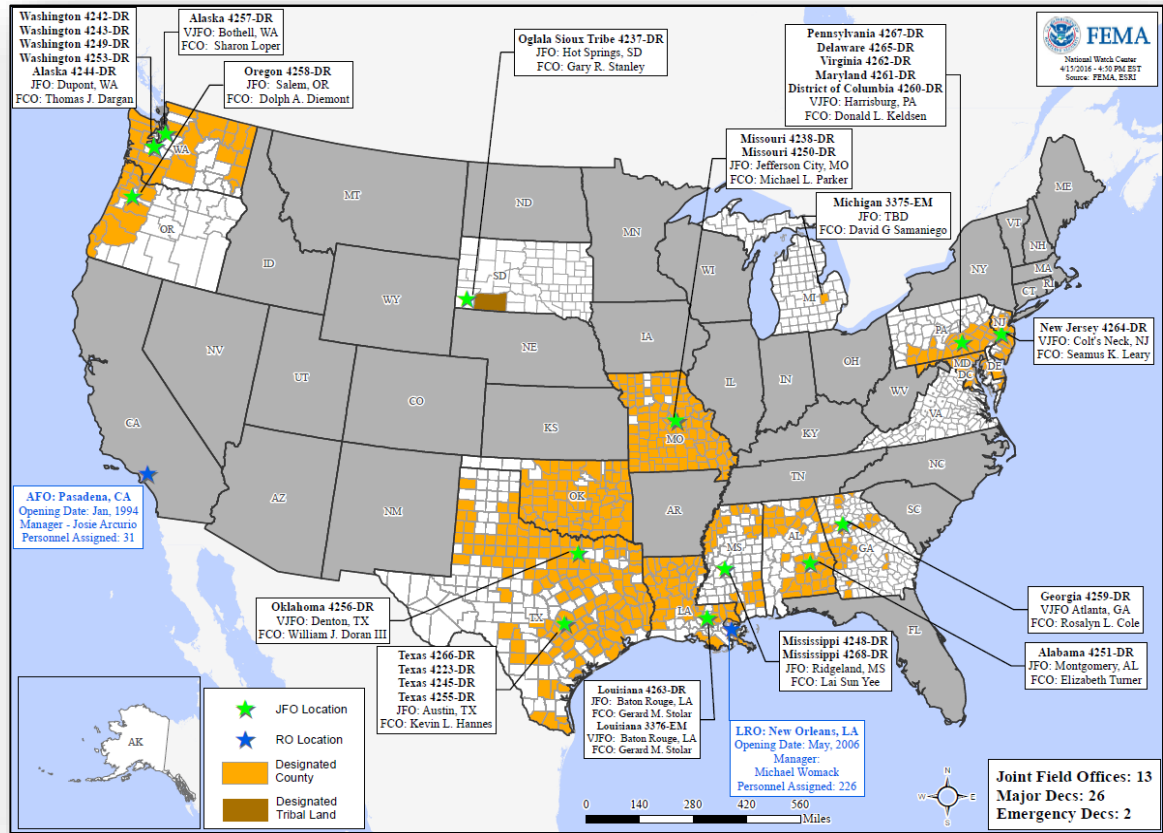
