Significant Activity: April 20-21



Significant Events: Texas flooding

Significant Weather:

- Flash flooding possible – Gulf Coast from Texas to Louisiana
- Rain and thunderstorms – Pacific Northwest and California; Central/Southern Rockies; Southern Plains to the Ohio Valley and Northeast
- Rain/snow – Sierras and the Upper Midwest
- Rain – Middle Mississippi Valley to the Upper Great Lakes; Southeast from Georgia to North Carolina
- Elevated Fire Weather Conditions – Portions of the Northeast from Pennsylvania/New Jersey to Maine
- Space weather – None observed past 24 hours; none predicted next 24 hours

Tropical Activity: Tropical Cyclone Amos (20P) – Southern Pacific

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Declaration Activity: FEMA-4263-DR in Louisiana amended to add 37 counties for Public Assistance

Flooding – Texas



Current Situation

- Severe thunderstorms and recent heavy rainfall (10 to 18 inches) continues to cause flooding across the central and southern Great Plains
- Localized flash flooding possible today; many rivers expected to remain above flood stage into next week

Impacts

- Minimal power outages remain across TX
- 4,561 homes identified as impacted (number expected to increase)
- Four water treatment plants have boil water notices in effect
 - One wastewater plant in Katy, TX (pop. 14k) is inaccessible, but functioning (full assessment of facility expected later today)
- Road conditions improving, though some remain impassible (I-10 frontage roads closed in Houston area)
- 8 (-4) American Red Cross shelters remain open with 327 (+67) occupants (ARC Shelter Report 6:00 am)
- Nine confirmed fatalities; no reports of injuries
- Assessments ongoing

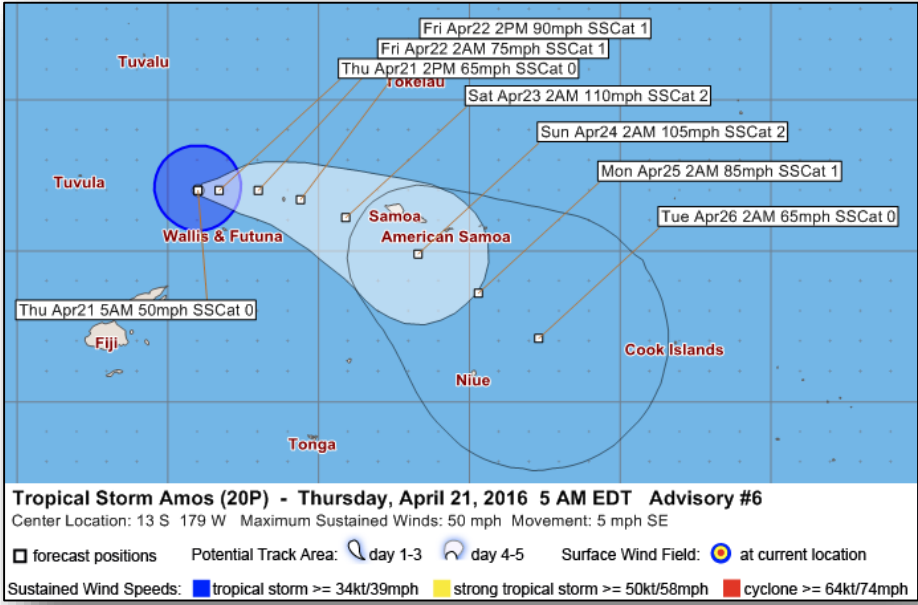
State/Local Response

- TX EOC at Monitoring (Level III; [dayshift only](#))
- Governor declared a state of emergency for 9 counties on Apr 18
- TX National Guard & SAR resources activated

Federal Actions

- FEMA Region VI RWC at Enhanced Watch 24/7
- FEMA Region VI LNO at TX EOC
- No unmet needs or requests for FEMA assistance

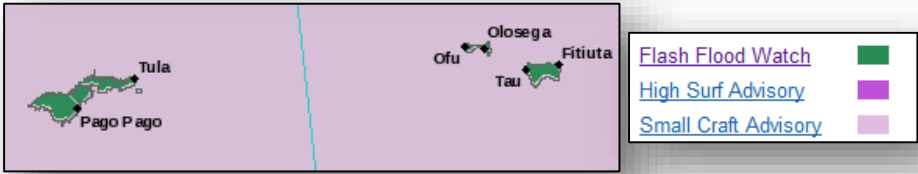


Tropical Cyclone Amos (20P) (Advisory #6 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

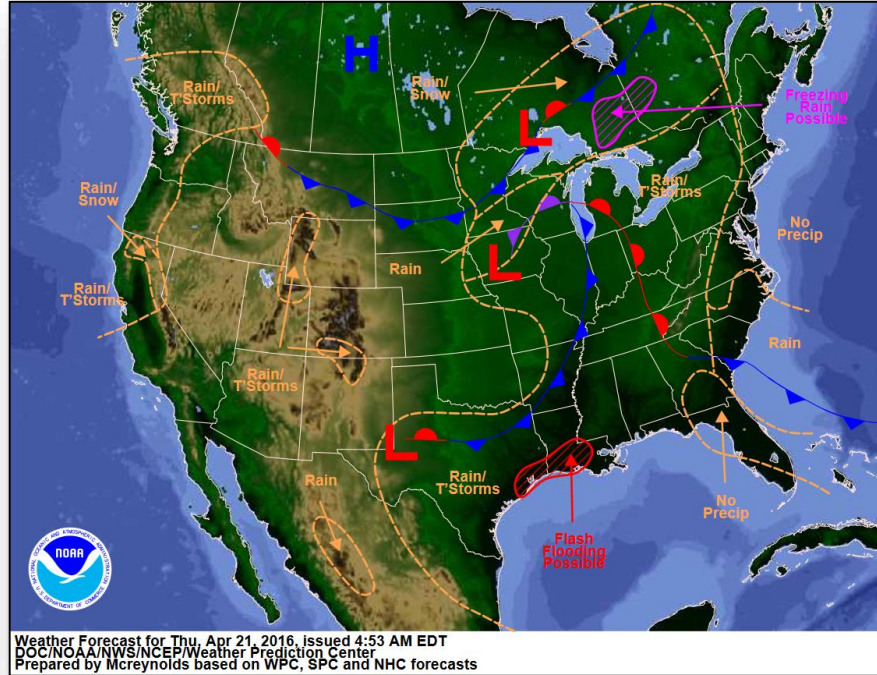
- Location: About 584 miles W of Pago Pago, AS
- Movement: SE at 5 mph
- Maximum Sustained Winds: 50 mph
- Rapid intensification is forecast during the next 48 hours, then gradual weakening thereafter
- Flash Flood Watch in effect for American Samoa through Saturday

Preparation

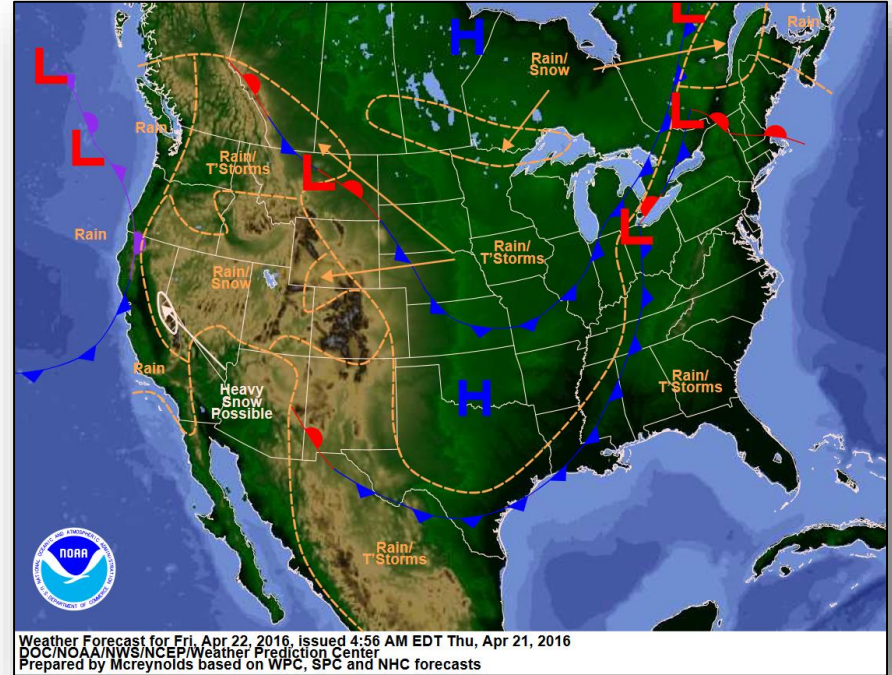
- FEMA Logistics Personnel (ISB Team) deployed to Hawaii for follow-on movement to American Samoa for potential impacts

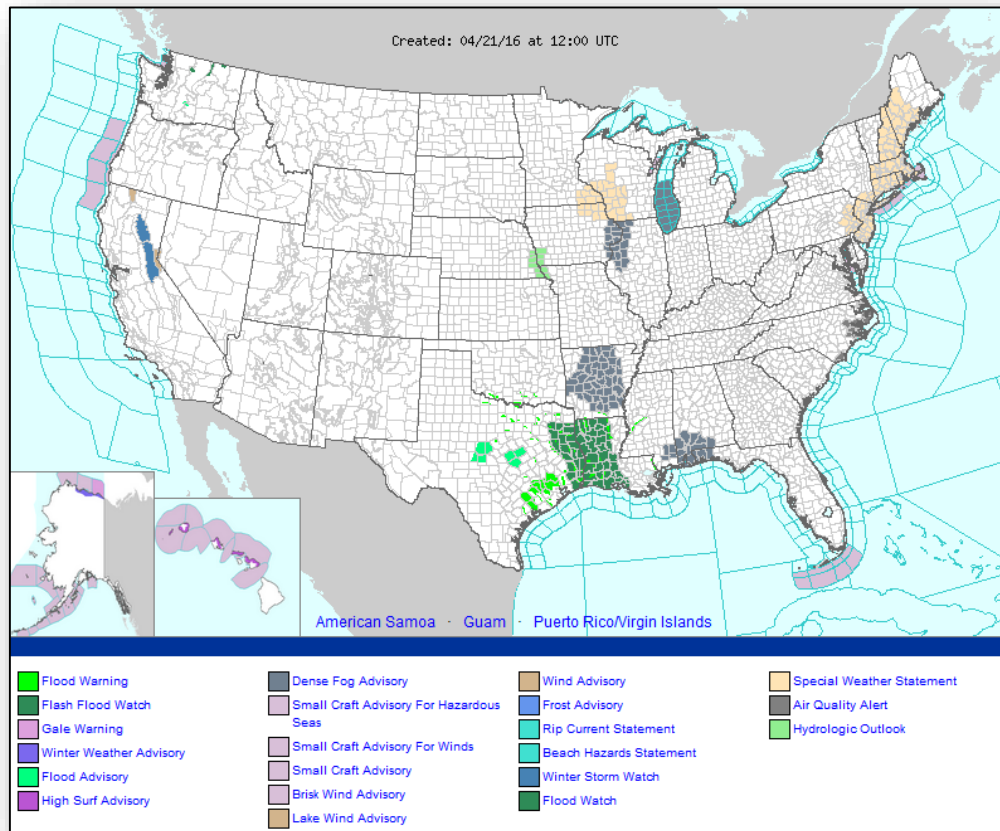

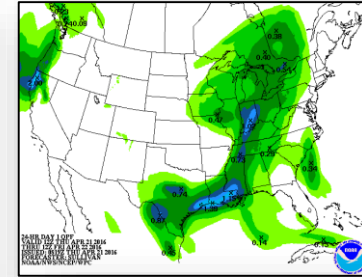
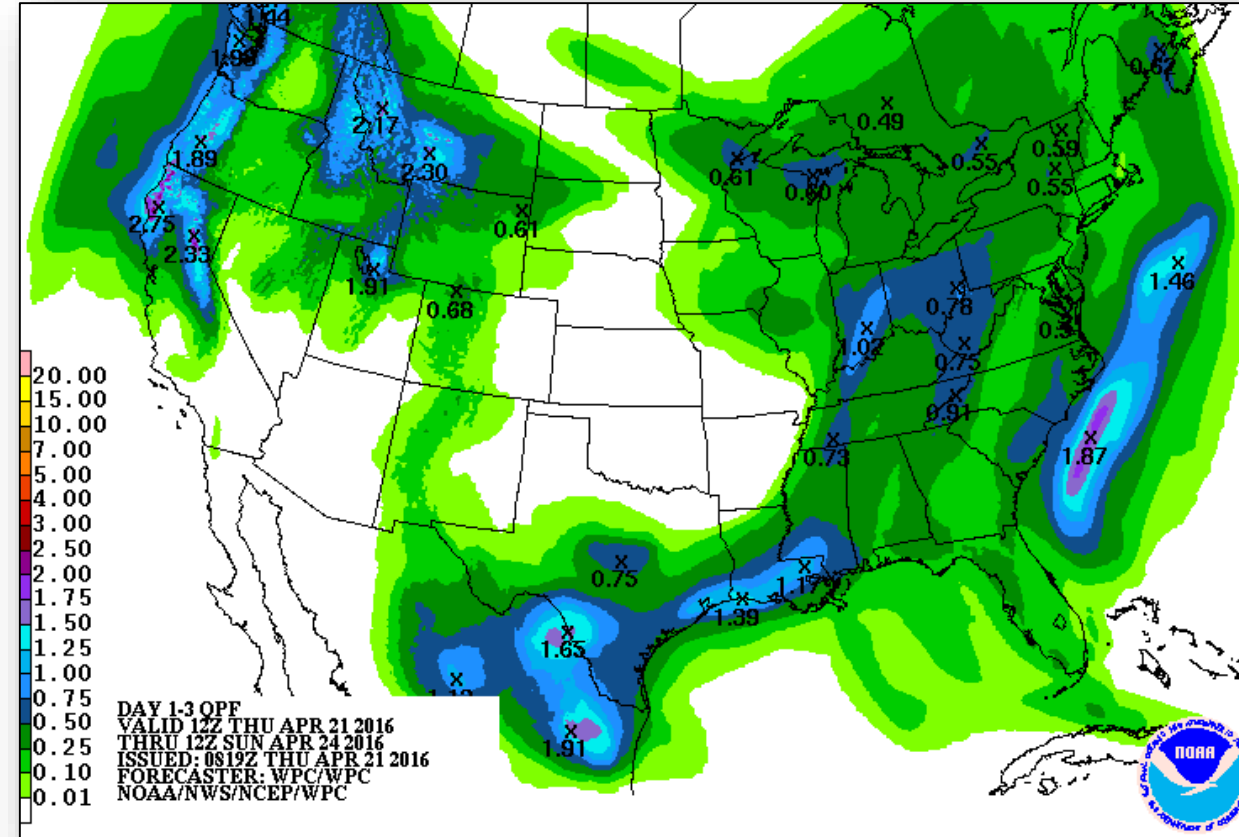
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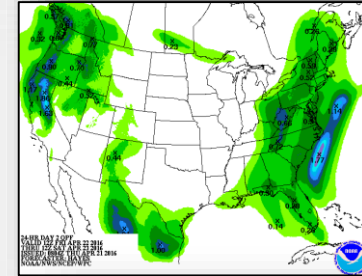
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



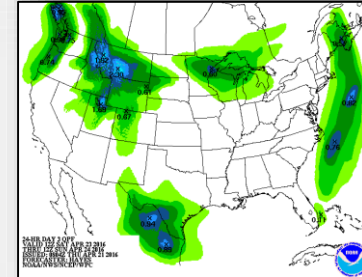

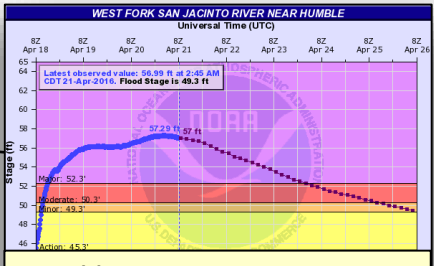
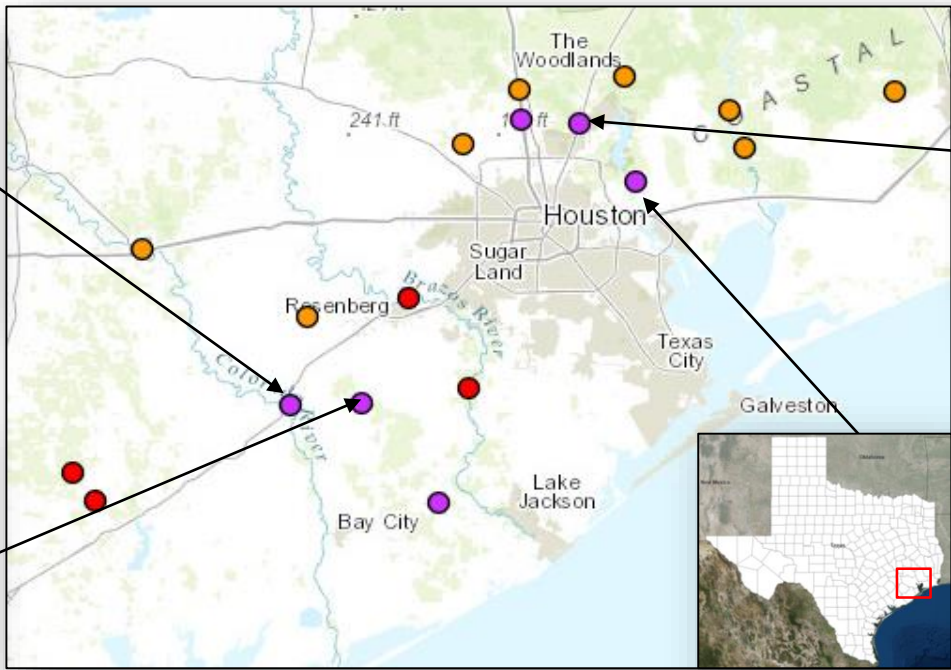
River Forecast



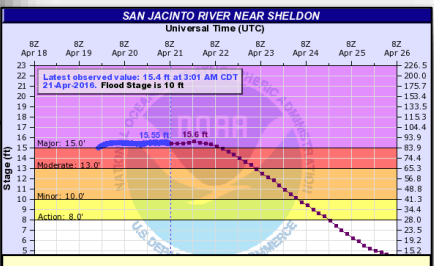
Potential Impacts:
48 feet: Major lowland flooding continues with much of west and southwest Wharton flooded. Most streets between Several streets are inundated and impassable and several homes have 3 feet of water in them.



Potential Impacts:
32 feet: Major lowland flooding occurs upstream from gage with significant backwater flooding up Peach and West Bernard Creeks in Wharton County and Snake Creek in Fort Bend County. Low lying subdivisions in Wharton County and Fort Bend County are inundated.

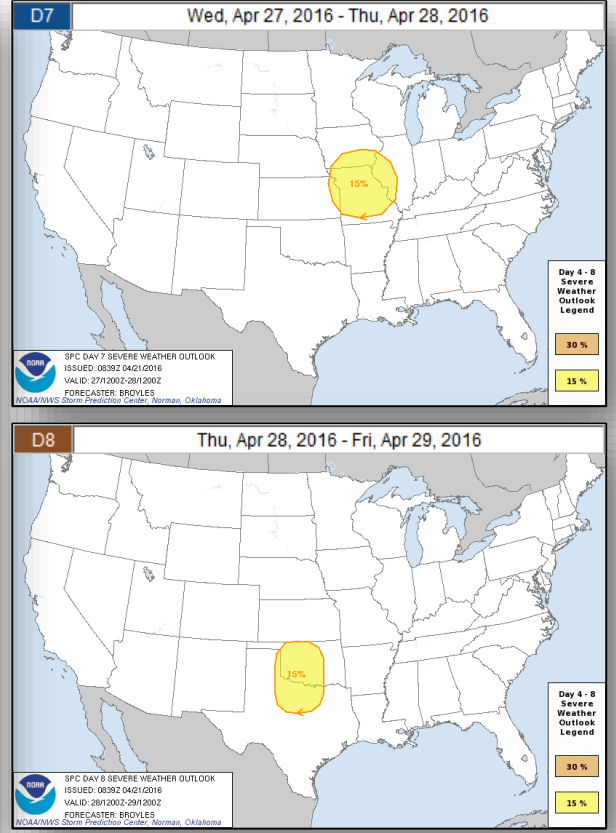
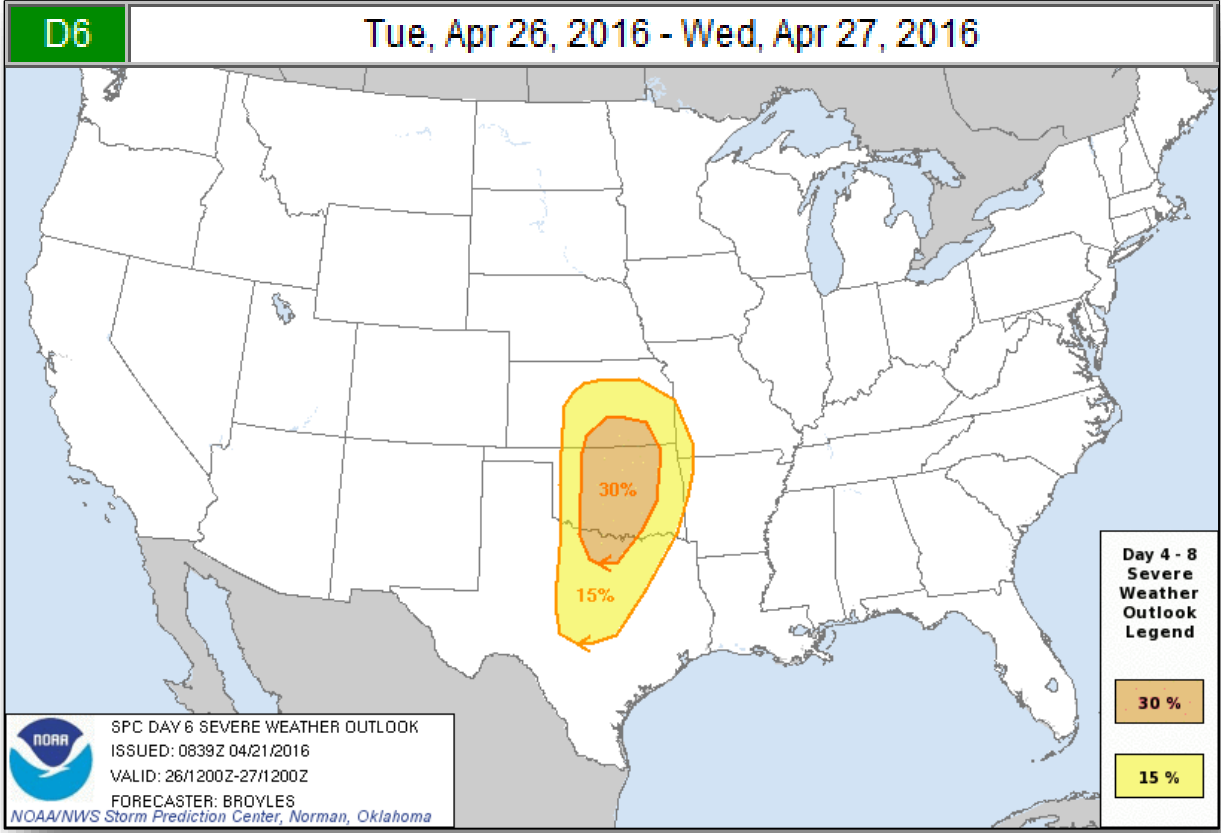


Potential Impacts:
55.2 feet: Major lowland flooding continues with up to 6 inches of water is over the 800 block Hamblen Road adjacent to the Kingwood Cove Country Club Golf Course with many homes in the Bellau Woods and Treasure Cove subdivision are flooded.



Potential Impacts:
Major flooding impacts low lying areas near the river in Sheldon. Waste Water Treatment Plant floods

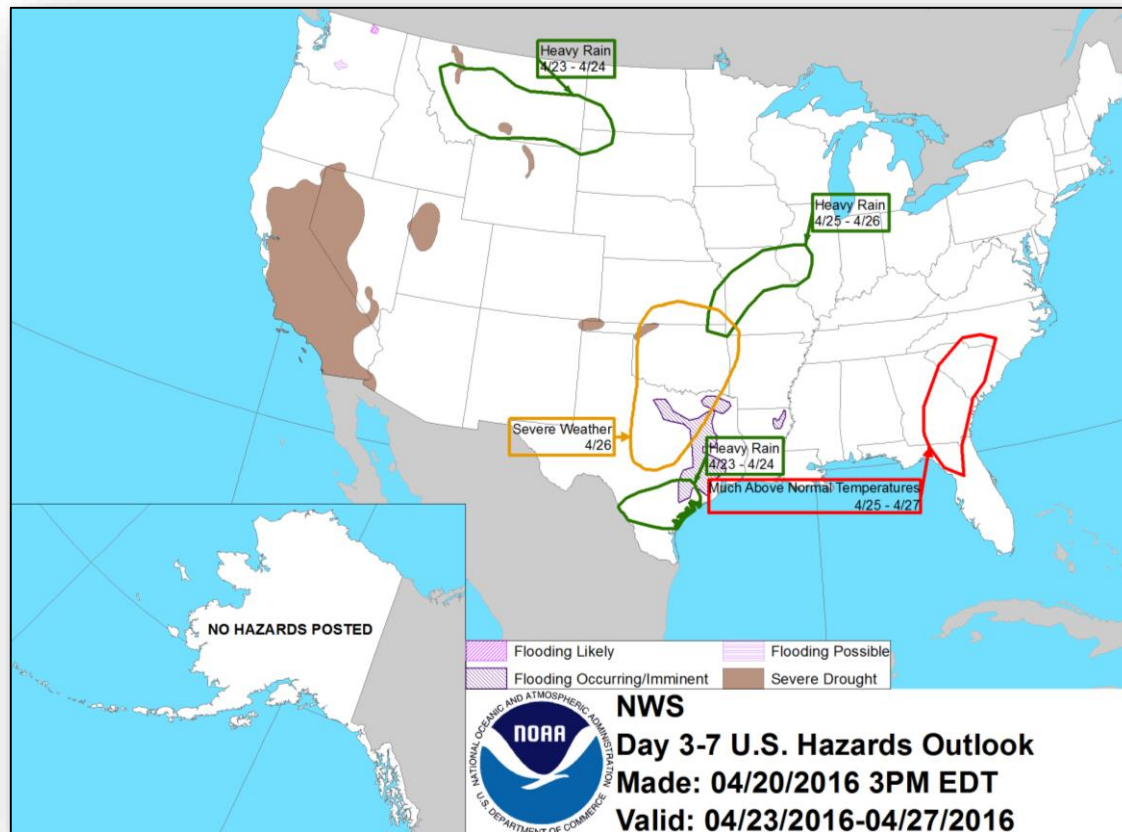
Convective Outlook Days 6-8



Hazard Outlook April 23-27

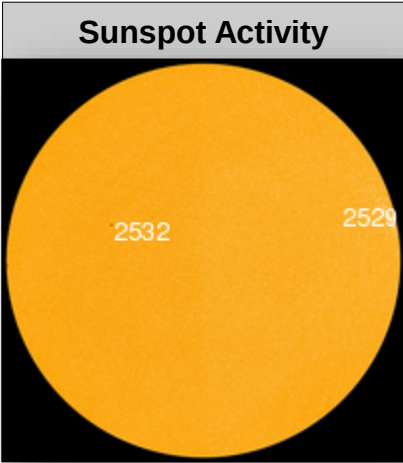
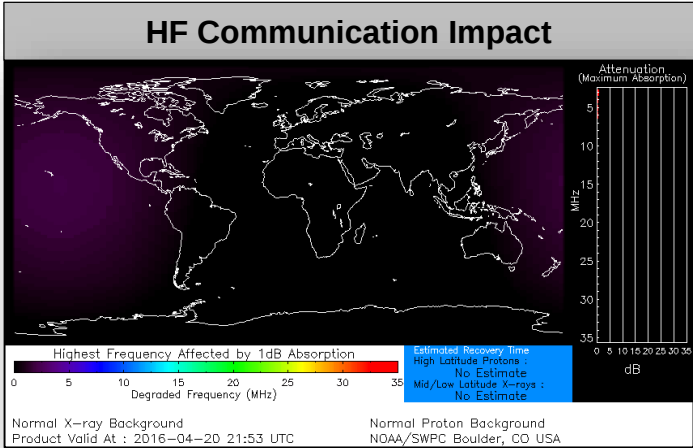

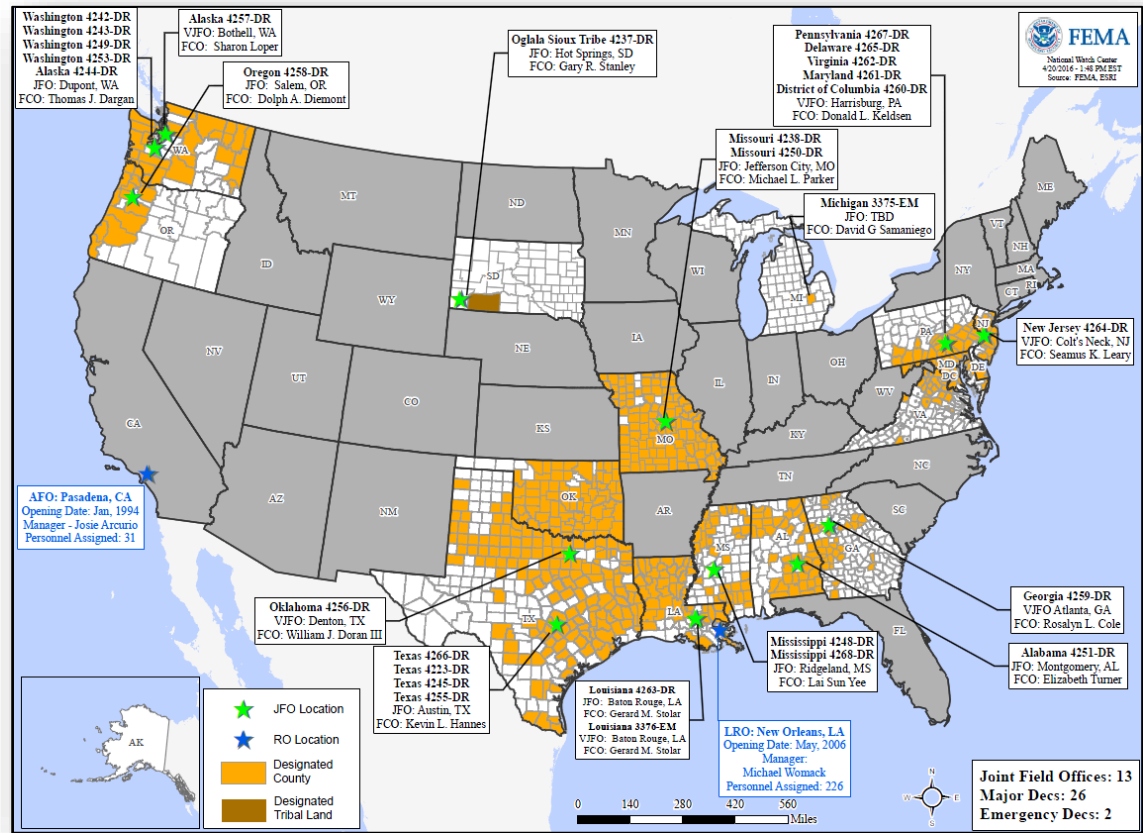
