Significant Activity - August 25-26



Significant Events:

- Gulf Coast Flooding - FINAL

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical Storm Gaston; Disturbance 1 (Invest 99L) – Low (20%); Disturbance 2 – Low (10%)
- Eastern Pacific – Tropical Storm Lester; Disturbance 1 (Invest 98E) – High (80%)
- Central Pacific – Disturbance 2 – Low (near 0%)
- Western Pacific – No significant activity threatening U.S. interests

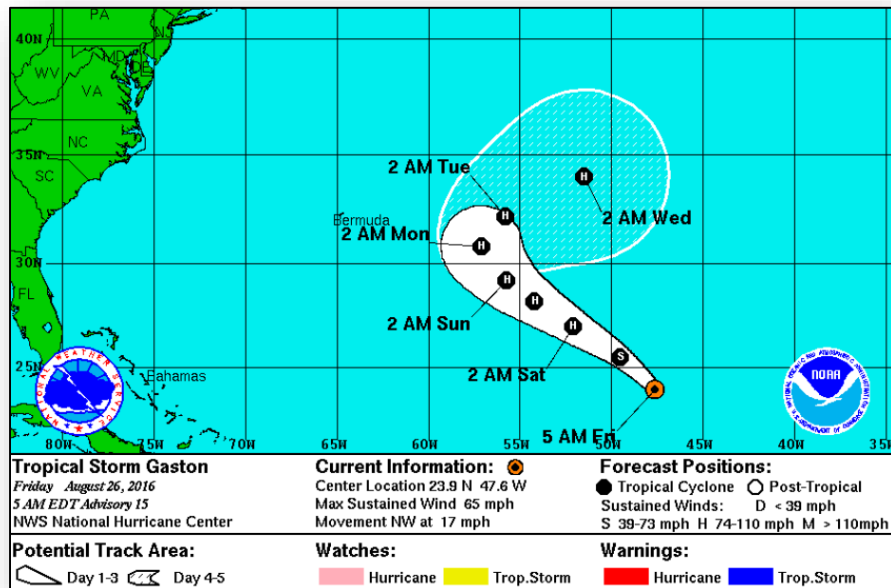
Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms – Central Plains
- Flash flooding – Central Plains to Ohio Valley
- Rain and thunderstorms – Northern Rockies to the Southwest, Great Plains to Ohio Valley and Southeast, Mid-Atlantic, New England
- Red Flag Warnings – OR & WA
- Space weather – No space weather storms occurred; none predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Declaration Activity: None

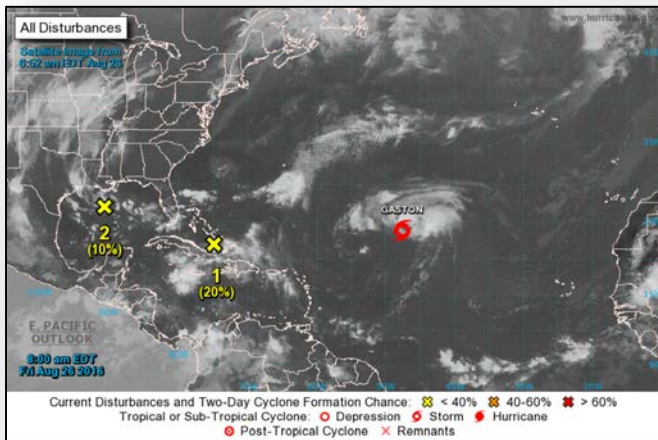
Tropical Outlook - Atlantic



Tropical Storm Gaston (Advisory #15, as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

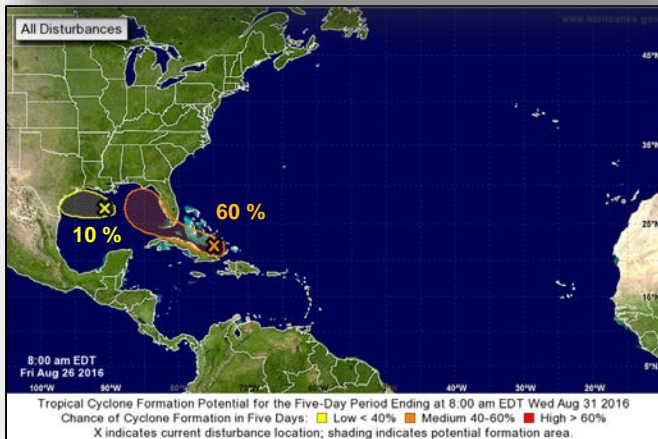
- Located 1,195 miles ESE of Bermuda
- Moving NW at 17 mph
- This general motion with a decrease in forward speed expected next couple of days
- Maximum sustained winds 65 mph
- Strengthening is forecast next 48 hours; could re-intensify to a hurricane by tonight or Saturday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 125 miles

Tropical Outlook - Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (Invest 99L) (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

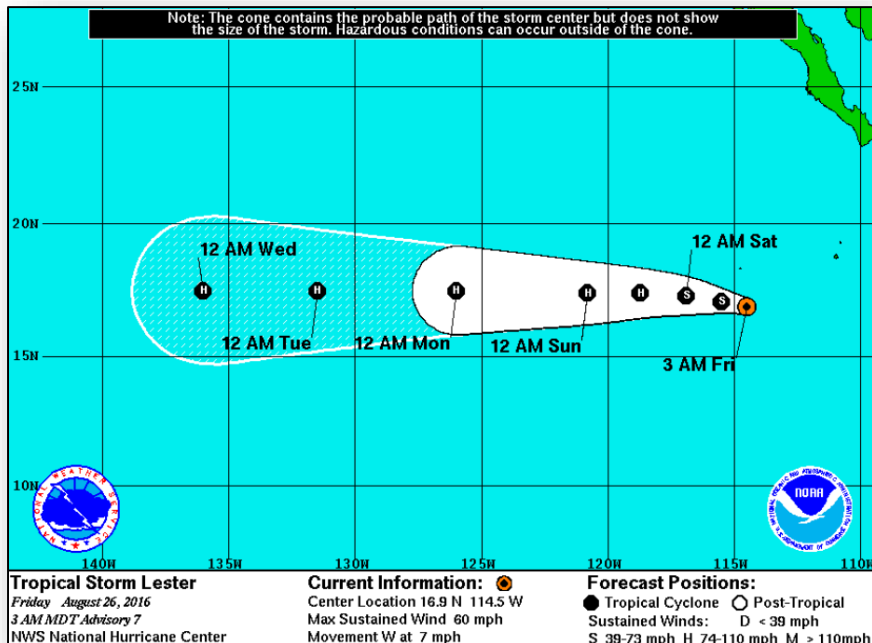
- Located between southeastern Bahamas and northeastern coast of Cuba
- Moving slowly WNW at 10 mph
- Not expected to be very conducive for development next day or so
- Conditions could become more a little more conducive for development over the weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)



Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located over north-central Gulf of Mexico
- Little to no development expected before reaching coast of TX over the weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

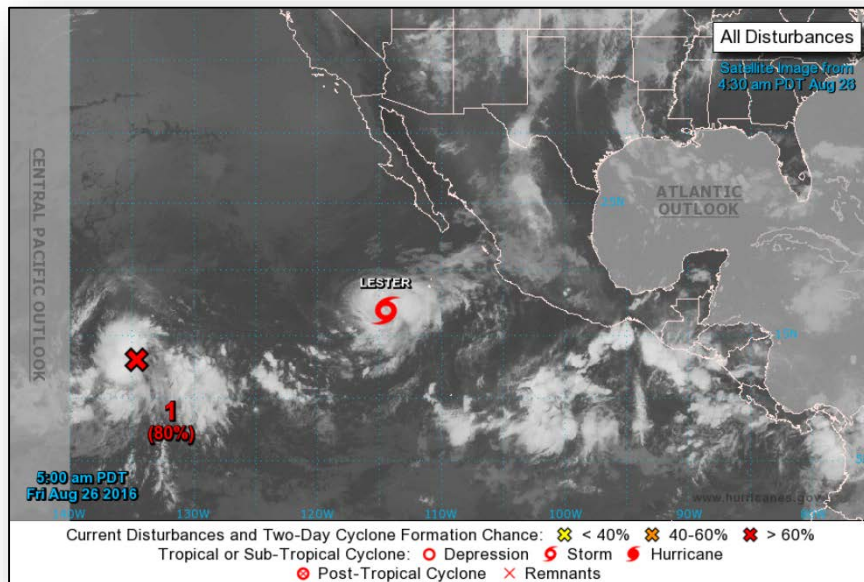
Tropical Outlook - Eastern Pacific



Tropical Storm Lester (Advisory #7, as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 510 miles SW of southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving W at 7 mph; a turn WNW should occur later today, then a turn back W tonight or Saturday
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Some strengthening forecast next 48 hours
- Could become a hurricane tonight or Saturday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 80 miles

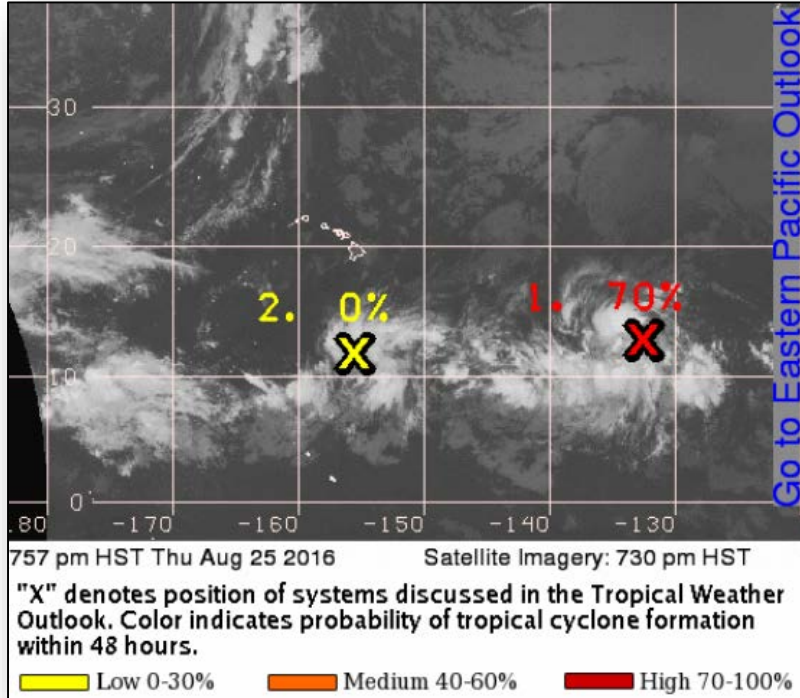
Tropical Outlook - Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (Invest 98E) (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,550 miles ESE of Big Island of Hawaii
- Moving W or WNW at 15 mph
- Showers and thunderstorms have become more organized
- Conditions expected to be conducive for development
- Tropical depression likely to form later today or Saturday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (80%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)

Tropical Outlook - Central Pacific



Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 550 S of Hilo, HI
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Conditions expected to inhibit tropical cyclone formation over the next couple of days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)

Flooding - Gulf Coast - FINAL



Current Situation

- Scattered afternoon showers and thunderstorms remain in the forecast through the end of the week
- No flood gauges are at major flood stage; Vermillion River at Lafayette is at moderate flood stage; Mermentau River at Mermentau is at minor flood stage

Louisiana Impacts

- 14 shelters open with 1,894 (-530) occupants *(ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:26 a.m. EDT)*

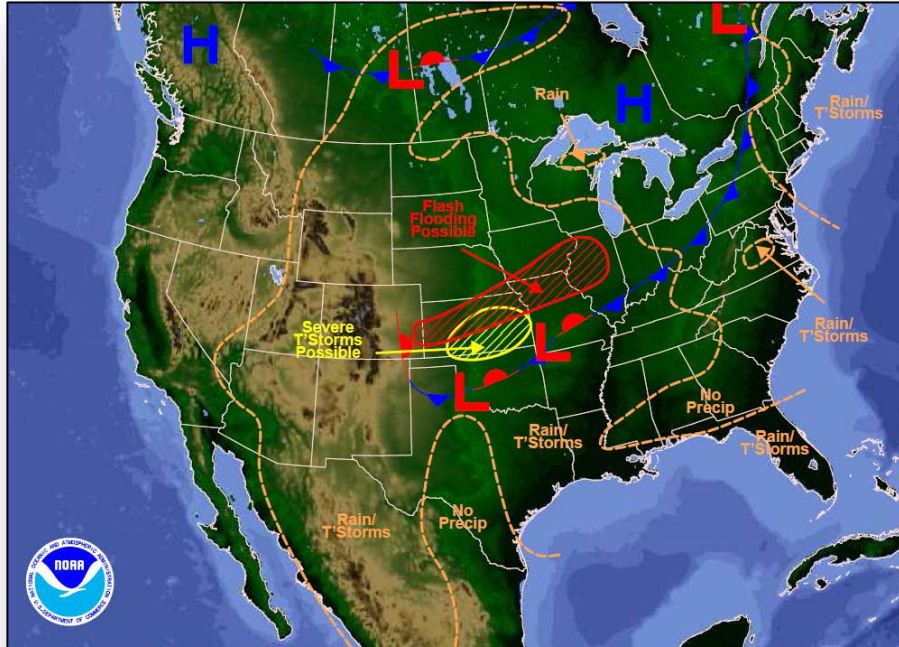

- LA EOC at Partial Activation (Level III), day shift only

FEMA Response

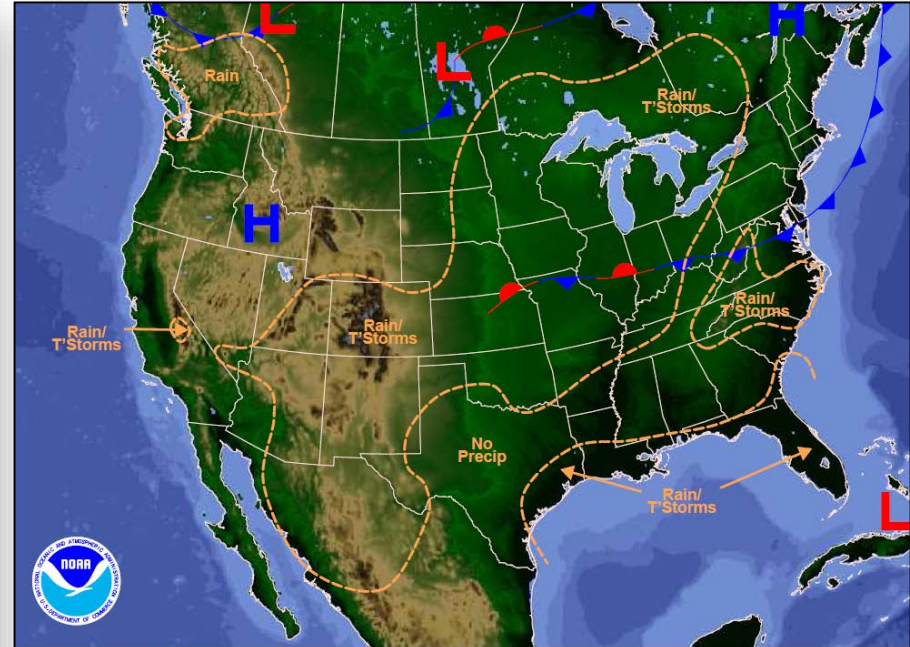
- NWC at Watch/Steady State
- Region VI RWC at Watch/Steady State; RRCC have activated to Level III (dayshift only) for Invest 99L
- Deployed to LA:
 - National IMAT East-2, Region IV IMAT-2, Region VI IMATs 1 & 2, Region VIII IMAT, Region X IMAT, Region VI LNO
- Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA):
 - Total IHP (Individuals and Households Program) approved: \$193 million as of August 26
 - Total TSA registrations: 124,637 as of August 26
- NFIP (National Flood Insurance Program) received 27,800 claims as of August 26
- FEMA has authorized and issued over \$55 million in advance payments to NFIP policyholders in LA
- 1,148 housing inspectors deployed as of August 26; 32,915 inspections completed as of August 26

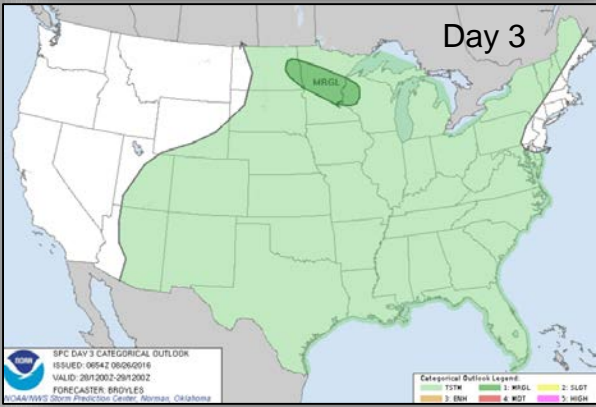
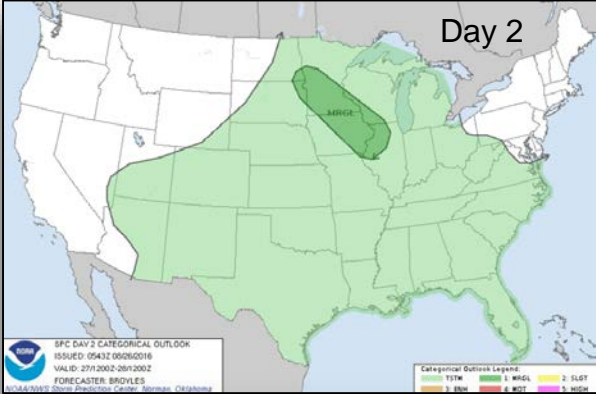
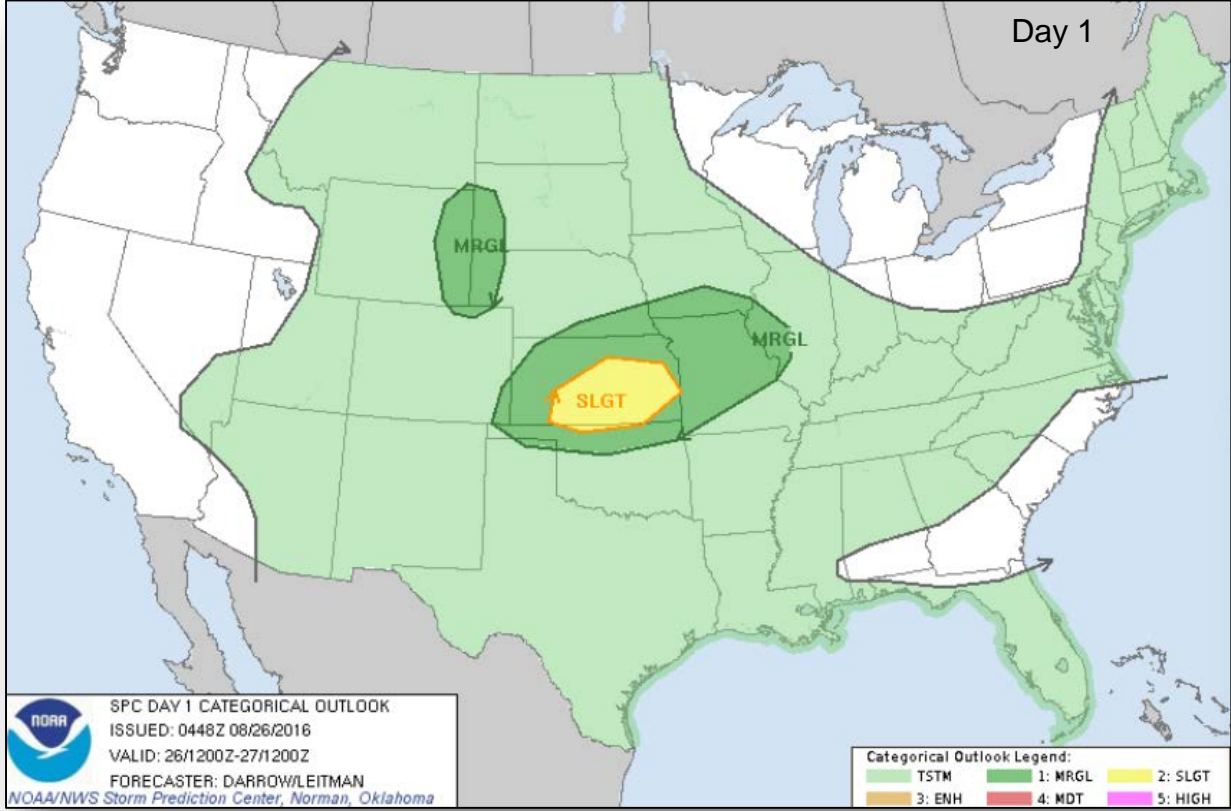
Precipitation Forecast - Days 1-3



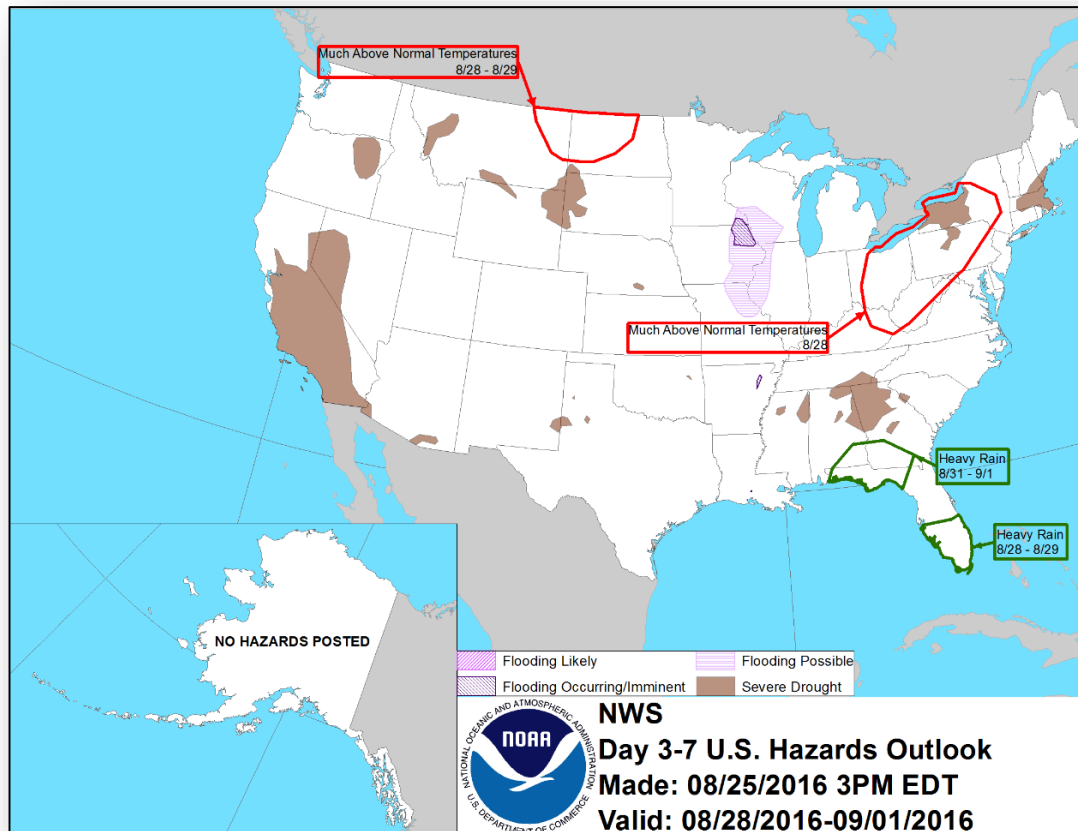
Precipitation Forecast - Days 4-5

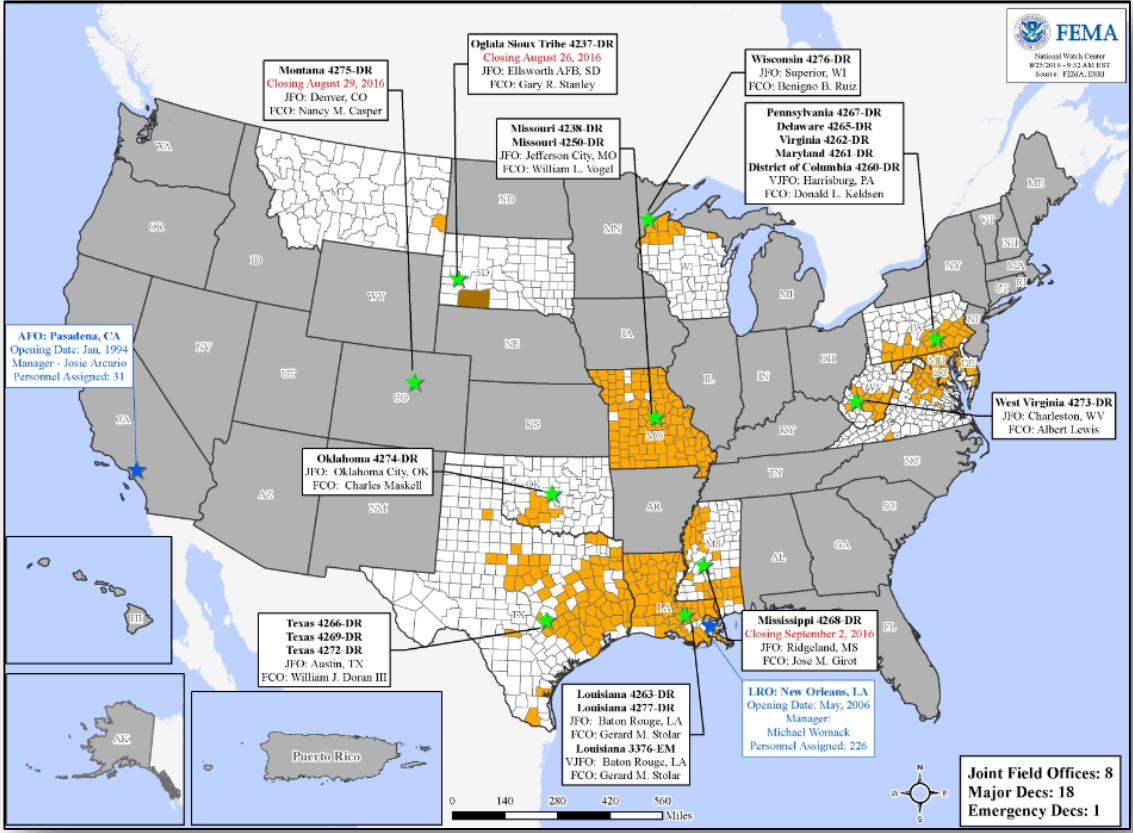
