

- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)









Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located a few hundred miles south of the coast of southern Mexico

- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)






Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific






National Weather Forecast









Today Tomorrow

Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3











- FCO is David G. Samaniego







HIGHLIGHTS AND BEST PRACTICES

- Initial staffing shortfall was filled by Region III staff
- IMATs utilized for setup of branch offices
- Appointed Deputy FCO to coordinate the housing mission
- Local haul, install, and maintenance contract used for direct housing mission saving \$288,990
- GSA used by Kanawha County and Nicholas County Board of Educations counties for temporary classroom contracting
- 91% of contracts have been locally sourced for this operation
- West Virginia School Building Authority staff were embedded within the School Task Force
- Early deployment of the Advance Evaluation Team led to better integration with the operation and early socialization of NDRF concepts with the state
